The season of Lent begins on March 1 this year with Ash Wednesday. Lent is the season in the church where we spend time in reflection and confession. Although every day should be a day where we enter a time of confession and repentance, Lent is a time when we become more intentional in allowing the Holy Spirit to “search our hearts and see if there is any wicked way in us.” It is this time of year, in the church, where we focus on the life, death and resurrection of Jesus. It is a time when we are reminded of how great is the Father’s love for us. Although I did not grow up in a church where Lent was observed, I have found as an adult it is an enriching season in my life. I find Holy Week and the celebration of Easter has a deeper meaning if I have spent some time thinking upon my sin and need for forgiveness during Lent.

I invite you to join me in a journey of study and worship this Lenten Season. We will begin our observance with an Ash Wednesday experience for both Adults and Youth in our Fellowship Hall following our evening meal on Wednesday March 1. Our worship experience will begin at 6:30 p.m. During the following weeks leading to Holy Week, we will gather in the Chapel at 6:30 p.m. on Wednesday and our study topic will be “The Way of Redemption.” This study was written by Rev. Tatum several years ago for our Youth Ministry and has recently been adapted for Adults. I am looking forward to studying with you on Wednesdays. Words from Katie

We have been talking this month about ways preschoolers learn. This week I wanted to spend a little time talking about allowing toddlers to make choices. Parents can reduce frustration by giving their children access to an acceptable levels of control. Though we would not offer the choice of whether or not to take a bath or go to bed, we might offer the choice of reading a book now and then taking a bath or taking a bath now and then reading a book. As long as parents are willing to offer legitimate, authentic choices and then live with the child's decision, a child's need for power is satisfied in an acceptable manner for the moment.

God gives us, His children, free will, so it's ok to pass His generosity on to toddlers in an age-appropriate way. Of course, children should not be offered a non-choice. A non-choice is phrased as an option, but the adult has already decided what will happen. Instead, parents should offer two options to a toddler. More choices than that can overwhelm this age group. There are hundreds of opportunities in daily living that can be offered to toddlers. We simply need to take advantage of them.

When parents offer choices, children learn that there are consequences to their choices. A consequence doesn't have to mean something bad. It merely means that there is a relationship between choices and

results. This aligns with God's example to us, too. We live with the consequences of our choices. Sometimes we have to come to Him for loving reassurance when we make unwise choices, but His arms are always open to us, as your arms should be to our toddlers in the midst of your child's decisions. So once decisions have been made, children need to learn to live with their choices. When we offer 2-year-olds the opportunity to choose, we satisfy the child's developmental need to become a more independent individual. By empowering children in this way, parents actually prepare their kids for future choices that have greater impact when they're older.
