Joining Hands with God

When I googled how many phobias are there, the list was endless. One list suggests that there are 530 documented phobias. However, the idea that there are endless subjects of our fear might mean that fear has no limits. If you look at a list of phobias you will find everything. There are those who fear heights, the dark, walking, driving, flying, insects, gold, insanity, mirrors, toads, women, men, confined space, money and even going to bed. I think you get the picture, when it comes to fear it is many times individual and fear does not seem to have limits. I do not in any way want to belittle the difficulty and uneasiness that certain fears inflict on so many people. As a young man in my early twenties, I struggled with anxiety attacks for almost two years. I have counseled many people over the years that have suffered from anxiety attacks, and I can attest they are very real cause of fear. Fear is real and for some people it is not merely a passing thought, it can be debilitating.

It is arguable how many times “fear not” or “do not be afraid” are found in the Bible. The claim is there are 365 “fear not” statements in the Bible. The interpretation of this is that God gave us one for every day. This is a wonderful thought and to be honest goes to the heart of our loving God and God’s promises. However, the problem is that it just is not true. Some claim there are only about 80 such statements found in the Bible. There are others who suggest that “fear not” is found in some form over 400 times in the Bible. Why the discrepancy? It depends on whether you are counting the word for fear, or the word fear with “fear not” or how you interpret various Hebrew and Greek words. This, of course, is a useless argument. It really does not matter how many times the statement “fear not” is found in the Bible. Are we to imagine that if God said “Fear not” only once in the Bible we are to view it as a lesser statement? Of course not. However, God says fear not over and over again. God speaks to our fearful people who are afraid for their lives, afraid of their calling and afraid of their situations.

The Bible speaks of numerous moments when God or God through Jesus speaks those words of comfort “do not be afraid.” However, we must admit that fear accompanies us throughout our lives. Our fears are sometimes valid and sometime they are not,




