## Words from Lydia

and events at Trinity. I am challenged by the task and overwhelmed by the necessity. However, my purpose is to bring assurance to parents so that quality teaching of the Bible and presenting the gospel is heard and internalized. That should be our ultimate goal.

How will this be accomplished? 1. Policies exsist that currently include all programing and events in which preschoolers and children participate. A security task force is updating and reviewing our current policies and to make them more current and efficient. Teachers, leaders and parents will be given policies to review and understand. Current ones are provided in various locations around the church or in the church office. Leaders will be given policies at time of training or enlisting. 3. Leaders will work with supervising ministers and/or division directors on proper maintenance and care of facilities used during their programing. Standards will be developed by supervising ministers and presented to leadership. 4. Workers with children, please take the time to attend sessions provided this year on First Aid or CPR to stay informed.

What is your role? Parents, you can inform all leadership of the needs of your child, share with each leader the security tag or pager you secured and only bring your child when he/ she is healthy and not contagious. As a parent, fellow educator or fellow user of the facility, we applaud your efforts to be consistent with our programing and use of the facility. We are grateful that you care about the children in your care and willingly maintain the proper security, safety and sanitizing measures in place. Please continue to alert us to concerns, inappropriate use of space and possible tips to help the ministerial leadership plan better. This may be uncomfortable at times as we attempt to get all programs on board. So you can help by encouraging our leadership and fellow users of the importance and goals we are trying to reach. You can also encourage our task force as they work toward our desires in the best way and provide security for all.
