Joining Hands with God

It is with a grateful heart that I write to you this week. Your prayers, concerns, cards and expressions of love and care have meant so much to Robin and me during this past week. My surgery went as expected and all news so far is good news. I am on course during my recovery and although there are many challenges still ahead, I am hopeful for a full recovery. There are many of you who have reached out to us during this time who have walked this same path and your words of encouragement have meant so much to us. In addition, I want to say thank you to a few of our leaders who have been walking this journey with me for two years now. Your willingness to carry this burden in silence with me was a great gift.

In an experience like this, there seems for be an inward pressure to share with you some earth shattering new insight or inspiration. The truth is that is not my experience. I have chosen to approach this challenge in my life as I have tried to encourage you to approach those in your lives.

We live in a world where our body's breakdown and sickness accompanies us. I received the news of cancer two years ago, as a matter of fact. I have never believed that Christians are immune from such diagnosis or experiences and that includes pastors. When I was first diagnosed, I received the news as a new reality that had to be addressed. I do not think God gave me cancer for some grand purpose. I believe my body, like so many others, produced cancer as part of a process of living and dying. I have cancer (or had cancer is my hope) and this is a part of living.

If I am willing, God will grant me the grace to face this challenge and mature my faith during this challenge. This has been my experience. The past two years I have been able to live with the knowledge that I have cancer without letting it overwhelm my thinking or affect my living or decisions. As I have moved to active treatment I have had peace of mind. I shared with Robin that an incredible peace came over me on the morning of the surgery. I have been blessed to never have surgery before. Everything I have been through this week is my first experience with surgery, recovery and medicine. I have taken more pills in the past week than I have in probably the past 5 years combined. All of this has been a new experience for me and yet, I have had great peace. God, as in all things, continues to teach and remind me of what is true. I am being reminded of what is important and urgent.

We do not have to live in isolation but have been given the gift of the church to share life. In a time when church has become a consumer good for so many in our culture, I still

25 Baptist Churches across Wake County are teaming up to build two Habitat for Humanity Homes this winter / spring – in 10 Weeks! Trinity has donated \$6,500 of the building materials cost and has three Saturdays that we will supply 25+ volunteers for the workday. Those Saturdays we also have a team from TBC that will supply lunch for the volunteers. Those dates are January 23, February 20 and March 19. Please go ahead now and commit these dates to working on these homes. The two families who will live in the homes have already been selected and are excited to get busy putting in their “sweat equity” hours and getting to know our volunteers.

Those 3 Saturdays are reserved for TBC (25) and one other church (25). **All Thursdays and Fridays between January 16 - March 19 are open first come first serve to 50 people from any of the churches.** One other special day has been set aside – **Youth Build - Monday, January 18, MLK Day.** On this day, the churches are encouraging their students 16 and older to come and build. They will of course need adults along with them (1 adult to each 5 students).

All Volunteers Must Register To Work On A Certain Day. This is to make sure we have enough volunteers, and not too many. To register for ANY of the workdays, Thursdays, Fridays, or Saturdays, just go to the Trinity Baptist website: www.tbcraleigh.com. Scroll down and look on the left side for “Habitat Volunteer”. Click on those words and it will take you to the Habitat for Humanity of Wake County Volunteer Registration web page. Fill out the form online, and please indicate that you are a member of TBC. **Students** – there is also a Parental Permission Form on the site that you will need to download and print out. Have your parents fill it out and bring it with you to the worksite.

All volunteers must be on the worksite by 8:00am. A brief safety orientation will be held and a discussion of the work that will be done that day. If you arrive after 8am, the foreman has to stop work and do an orientation just for you. So please be PROMPT.

Two more important things.

1) **Saturday, January 16th, all volunteers will meet at 7:30am** at the Habitat building Workshop at 2728 Capital Boulevard, Suite 164. All the exterior and interior walls to the houses will be built inside the workshop, then loaded onto trucks and taken to the worksite. At 11:45am there will be a “Wall Raising” and blessing ceremony for the two homes. After that, the roof will be put on and the first day will be completed.

2) **Sunday, January 17th at 4:00pm** at Springfield Baptist Church, 4309 Auburn Knightdale Road, Raleigh, there will be a **“Baptist Build Kick-off Worship Service”** involving members or all 25 churches. They will even have a Mass Choir...you will need to arrive at 3:30 to rehearse two old standards... Amazing Grace and Holy, Holy, Holy.

When Can a Child Believe?

Have you ever wondered at what age or what point in time a person becomes accountable to the Holy Spirit and God? When do we begin to realize our true spiritual condition that determines whether we are saved or lost? The New Testament writers did not specifically list practices and ideas of the 1st century church in relationship to children.

And we must understand that the Bible does not offer one way of salvation for children and another way for adults. The basics in the conversion experience are the same regardless of the age of a person. Accountability relates to one's ability to deal with the basic truth of the gospel. Until a child, youth or adult reaches this point, he/she is scarcely to be judged accountable.

Dr. William Hendricks in the book, *Children and Conversion*, summarizes several basic facts in terms of having faith in God who brought the facts to be. 1. Jesus came from God, the God of Israel who made heaven and earth. 2. People killed Christ. Therefore we all bear responsibility in Christ's death. 3. Yet, Christ's death was according to God's plan. 4. Christ is raised from the dead. 5. God through Christ has sent the Holy Spirit to bear witness to what God in Christ has done for us.

When Dr. Hendricks speaks of faith in God, he is talking about something a lot deeper than a childish affirmation that "I love God" or "God is good." He suggests that the faith which brings salvation "is accompanied by a despair of oneself and all other created things. The despair is evidenced by repentance. Repentance involves sorrow for sin. It is the sorrow for rejecting God."

We do not expect children, youth, or adults to express these feelings in adult theological terms in order to be saved. But we must not dismiss that some understanding of these truths need to be real in the life of a person as conversion takes place. [Taken from *When Can a Child Believe* by Eugene Chamberlain]
