In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth! The first picture we receive from the Bible about God is of God a creator. The picture from Genesis 1 and 2 is a picture of a God who is creative, purposeful, imaginative, powerful and “hands on.” To affirm that God exists is the first step of faith, but to also affirm God as creator of all things takes our faith to another level. When I affirm that I am created, I automatically make some assumptions. If I am created, then there must be an act of worship. How can one who is created seek to worship the One who is the creator? The very idea that a being that is of the created order not recognizing the Creative One as a higher being is not logical. If I affirm that I am created, then worship is a logical and natural response. When I affirm that I am created, then I also accept that life has a purpose beyond my own desires and will. In the creation story, we find God acting with a purpose and if I am created with a purpose, then my life becomes purposeful. As a created person, I begin to ask questions beyond myself. I begin to wonder what is my place in the created order and my purpose for being created.

As I affirm God as creator, I also affirm humanity’s place in this created order. Only man and woman were created in the image of God and thus, we can embrace the very characteristics revealed in the God of creation. I too can explore my own creativity, ingenuity, and imagination. I can join God in the work that God began. I discovered, as part of the created order, a desire to make my work a “holy endeavor” presented to God as an offering of love and devotion. What does affirming God as creator mean to you? How does thinking about yourself as “created” change the way you consider what is important, how you work and how you worship?

This past Sunday night, our church voted to take the next steps in the process toward our new addition. The Trustees made a motion for the Facilities Long Range Planning Committee to resume their work with our architects with the purpose of developing the detail plans, so that we might attain bids and the church can then vote on the full proposal and plan. The motion, which was passed in Church Conference read:

The Trustees move: That the Facilities Master Planning Committee re-engage the architectural firm, WKWW, Inc., to complete plans and contract bid documents for bidding Trinity’s proposed new addition, and receive and review bids, establish a budget and timeline, work to involve other committees in planning for construction, and propose an executable plan, budget, timeline, transition plan, and contractor back to the church for vote during a future special called business meeting. Any necessary funds not already set aside for this purpose executing these activities

Preschoolers and Faith

Preschoolers are at the beginning of understanding who they are and who God wants them to be. They arrive in the world with an openness and eagerness to do and to be. They are constantly learning. Preschool children are like young sponges soaking in everything that is around them through all their senses.

One of the obvious ways a preschooler learns is by imitating life as he or she sees it or experiences it. Most of what they imitate is family because that is what they experience daily. A preschool child might wash a dish in the dramatic play area of the classroom because they see that at home. They may rock a baby doll to sleep or set the table with play dishes or maybe act like they are driving a car.

So how does a child learn to respect and love others? She begins to learn by the way she is loved and respected. Preschoolers follow the lead of adults in their lives. Actions as well as words of adults teach the child.

So how does a child learn about God and discover a faith? By trusting the significant adults in their world and following their lead. How are you shaping the children in your care? They are watching and imitating you. What are you teaching? You may see it in their actions.

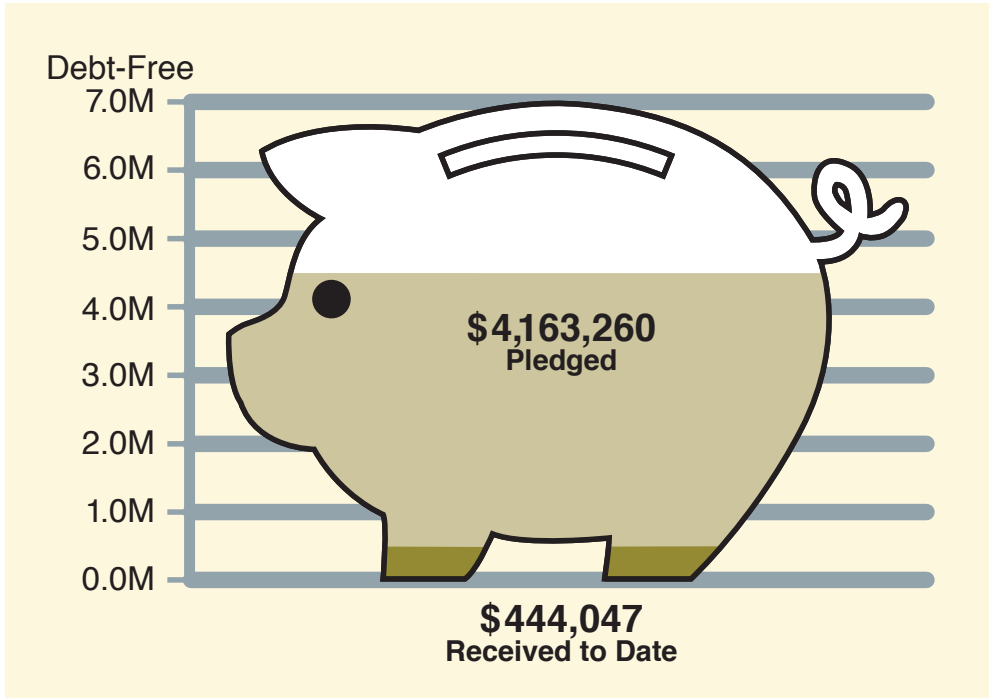
Capital Campaign Update
