### Joining Hands with God

We had a great beginning to the Seasons of Lent this past Sunday. Kim Mays testimony reminded us all of how fragile our sense of control really can be and yet, how good God is to us. Kim reminded us that “God does not owe us an explanation for our suffering” but “God is sovereign and working in our lives for God’s glory.” Thank you for inspiring us, Kim.

This coming Sunday, we continue our series on the topic of “Give It Up.” We will be focusing on the thought of giving up idols from 1 Corinthians 10. I recently heard a definition of an idol as whatever you turn to when the chips are down. Whatever we use to sooth ourselves or recover worth when something goes wrong might just be our idol. It might be that we find comfort in knowing we are a good parent, a faithful spouse, a hard worker, or maybe we are physically fit or scored high on the SAT. We might find our comfort in our title, wealth or social connections. Most of the time, those who are followers of Jesus are not so much tempted to make that which is evil our idol, as much as we are tempted to exchange some part of God’s good creation for God.

As we prepare for worship this Sunday, I want to encourage you to consider what rivals your devotion to God. Is it something that is destructive or is it something we all would consider good. Is it your job, success, family, athletics, art, music, reputation... and the list goes on. All of these are good gifts from God, but can surely become our idol. Let us reflect this week on what it means to place Jesus and His kingdom first and let all these other things be added to us.

Our Sunday night series “What Does the Bible Say About...?” continues this week at 6:00 p.m. in the Chapel. This week Dr. Warf will lead a study on “What Does the Bible Say About the Bible?” Understanding the Bible as God’s Word and what that means and how to then read it and apply it is of vital importance for us. I hope you will join us for this important discussion.

Words from Lydia

In Church history and our early theology from the Church Fathers, there is a Latin phrase that I keep coming back to this Lent – felix culpa. Saint Augustine (354-450AD) wrote of this idea of his gratitude that we should have the privilege of knowing such a great Redeemer in Jesus. Felix means “happy,” “blessed,” “lucky,” or “fortunate,” and culpa means “fault” or “fall.” So, many times it is translated “fortunate fall” or “happy fault.”

During Lent, we spend time thinking about our own sin and the reason for Jesus’ ultimate act of love and sacrifice on the cross. Without the sin of the world, the need for such a Savior would have never existed. This idea of felix culpa seems a bit odd to us at first. It seems that we are celebrating the

Fall and our alienation from God. Though we are not to celebrate our sin or sin more so that grace abounds, we must be reminded that our sin, the sin that nailed Jesus on the cross, also gave us the fortunate, lucky, blessed, and happy chance to know God in this intimate and beautiful way.

As we journey toward the cross over these next few weeks, think on the depth of relationship that we are offered with God because of Jesus’ life, death, and resurrection. Felix culpa is the rejoicing in the relationship we have with God through Jesus. Felix culpa is our Easter story. Jesus showed us God’s love in all of its intensity. He showed us humility. And, He invited us into the intimacy of the Trinity. How fortunate are we that despite our fault we are given the chance to know our Lord.

## Building Foundations of Faith in Preschoolers

Faith development for preschoolers begins at birth. During the early years of kids' lives they are beginning to develop a sense of trust. This sense of trust will play an important role in kids' ability to trust in a God whom they cannot see, because they can trust the significant adults in their life whom they can see. Trust develops somewhat like this:

*If you feed me when I'm hungry... then, the God you talk about must be real.*

*If you change my diaper when it's soiled... then, the Book you talk about called the Bible must really be God's messages to me.*

*If you pick me up when I'm hurting and sing, "Yes, Jesus loves me"... then, I begin to develop warm, loving feelings toward Jesus.*

As the preschooler grows and develops, effective teachers and parents share Bible content in such a way that the child can understand best:

- Because preschoolers are literal minded... teachers/parents should avoid symbolic language as they share Bible stories.
- Because preschoolers are curious ... teachers/parents provide opportunities for them to discover exciting Bible truths.
- Because preschoolers have limited attention spans ... teachers/parents limit the length of both active and passive learning times while learning from the Bible.
- Because preschoolers value relationships ... teachers/parents get involved in the learning experiences of children ... down where the child is.
- Because preschoolers have God-given needs ... teachers/parents love them unconditionally so that the children can learn about God's unconditional love.

There is so much truth to this statement: With preschoolers, you can't begin too soon to lay foundations in their lives upon which God can build and draw them into a personal relationship with Him!
