## Following Jesus...

One of the questions that constantly challenges the church is how to be relevant within a secular culture. In the history of the church, there has been times when the church was separated from culture and counter culture. There have been times when the church has been part of the culture and a transforming part of the culture. There have also been times when the church has been the "culture." In nations where there was and is a "state" church, the church dominated the culture and this was not good for the church or the culture. It is always dangerous spiritually when the church looses its unique voice in culture.

In my life, I would suggest that I have seen one of these shifts. Although many might argue that the church never really dominated American culture, for me growing up in the south as a Baptist, life revolved around the church and seemingly everyone I knew went to church somewhere or at least recognized they needed too. It was an accepted part of life that church was to be a part of your life and if it was not, then there was surely something wrong with you. This was not just the church's opinion, it was present in the culture. If you were going to run for office you better belong to a church if you even thought of being elected to office. If you were going to be a civic leader it was advantageous for you to be a church member. These norms are no longer true in most places in the United States. The church has lost its influence in the sense that being a member of a church is a prerequisite for being accepted and respected in culture. In fact, in many places being a part of the church is a foreign experience. Increasingly dedicated Christians who make the church a central part of their family's routine and experience are seen as odd and out of touch with what is truly important. As Andrew Root reminds us "you don't get scholarships for going to youth group meetings but for playing soccer, hockey, basketball, lacrosse, playing in the band etc." The adult version of this is you don't get a raise for serving in the church, but for working longer and neglecting worship and the work of the congregation.

The shift from church dominating culture to church within culture has caused many of us to be anxious about our culture and the future of the church. We fear the day when the church becomes completely counter cultural (many will argue we are there). When the church becomes truly counter cultural, then real persecution becomes a part of the church's experience. This is evident in many places in the world. Many would argue the

Words from Andy In a blog post by Dr. Tommy Givens, a New Testament Studies professor at Fuller Seminary, he challenges the "old" definition of the Gospel. Dr. Givens defines the "old" definition as a "boiled-down series of abstract statements to be "believed." He describes them as "colorless statements about God's love, sin, and Jesus' death." He argues that the problem with this gospel is that it narrows the focus to just theories about God and the world. He states, "The result is a gospel that underestimates the difficulties of life, promotes pat answers to hard questions and shallow interpretation of the Bible, and is boring."

So what is the Gospel according to Dr. Givens? "It is a contextually sensitive rendering of the history in which [Christians and non-Christians] bodily find themselves, a story through which the God of Israel has been gathering a very imperfect people in order to bless them and the whole world

This is the Gospel our students and young adults are willing to surrender their lives to. The impactful nature of God's relationship with His creation and our relationship with one another will bring true meaning to "Jesus is Lord." May we live and preach this powerful Gospel to all.
