What are the moments you remember the most? It might be a day of celebration like a graduation day or wedding day. It could be a special Christmas or Easter celebration. It might be the day you chose to follow Jesus and the day you were baptized. All of those days are special days and when we recall them they bring to us joy. There are other days we remember which remind us of grief. The day someone close to you died or a moment when you were scared and facing a difficult physical diagnosis. It could be the day you were laid off from work or were facing an uncertain time in a relationship. There are many days, whether they are days of joy or days of challenge that we remember. Our memory is a powerful gift from God. We know the pain of watching loved ones loose their capacity to remember. In those moments we give God thanks for our memories, even those that are difficult.

This coming Sunday we will gather at the Lord's Table to again remember the Lord's death, resurrection and promise of return. When we read the story of what we refer to as the "Last Supper," we are struck with the emotions of the moment. There are the emotions of joy, sorrow, disappointment and anticipation. As Jesus prepares his disciples for his death he does so with a meal that would take on new meaning and purpose. As we come to the table this week we are going to explore the gift of memory and the power it can play in our lives as followers of Jesus. I hope you will join us this week as we begin our steps toward the cross and Easter, as we consider "Moments Remembered."

As a part of our Lord's Supper Day at church we will also be asking you to remember those who are in need in our community. Each time we gather at the Lord's Table we also use that Sunday to minister to our community. You are encouraged to bring some can foods with you as part of our food drive for North Raleigh Ministries and also to be reminded that at the end of each of our services we will receive a Love Offering that goes directly to North Raleigh Ministries for the benevolent help in our community.

I am looking forward to coming to the Lords' Table with you this coming Sunday.

TBC's Giving Plans – Your Choice

Since 2010, Trinity has offered its members a choice of mission giving to either the NC Baptist State Convention, the Southern Baptist Convention, the NC Cooperative Baptist Fellowship, National Cooperative Baptist Fellowship, or Trinity Baptist missions.

Each year, the new budget includes an estimate of what we will give to each organization. This amount is a percentage of the undesignated offerings we receive. In addition, one half of one percent of undesignated offerings is given to the Raleigh Baptist Association.

Using the choice of designations shown on members' offering envelopes, the financial administrator applies a formula to calculate the amount of money to send to: the Raleigh Baptist Association, the NC Baptist State Convention – Southern Baptist Convention, and the NC Cooperative Baptist Fellowship - National CBF

Several examples of support from each organization include:

NC Baptist State Convention: Baptist scholarships, Baptist Retirement Homes, Baptist Children's Homes, Baptist Hospital in Winston-Salem, and the Biblical Recorder

NC Cooperative Baptist Fellowship:

Baptist supported colleges and universities in N.C., plus scholarships to these schools, the Baptist Retirement Homes, Baptist Children's Homes, Women's Missionary Union, and the Baptist Men.



The Power of Presence An article for all fathers by John Blase

I recently found myself in an uncomfortable situation. I was given the Nintendo Wii controller by my son and in no time at all lost all my "lives" and allowed the virtual galaxy to run amuck. My son was quite gracious in the moment. Dad, it's o.k. Just sit with me and watch and you'll get it. I know you will. And so I did. I sat and watched and sat and watched and sat and watched and sat and watched.

Another moment like this occurred. Not a lot of anxiety in this one, but I had to sit down. My daughter asked me to look through a catalog with her. *Just sit with me, dad. This'll only take a minute.* We sat and looked at every page until we came to the reason for our sit-down. The correct size and color were emphasized, followed by a hug around the neck, a kiss on the cheek, and something like *you're the greatest dad ever!*

Moments like this seem to be popping up all over my fathering landscape. Moments where I'm reminded of something called the power of presence. Now, lest you think I'm the greatest dad ever, rest assured that for every moment when I've stopped to smell the roses with my children, there have been twice as many moments where the roses had to take a back seat to my own, "more important" little world. But kids are gracious and I'm learning. I'm learning how utterly vital it is to them that I, the father, set aside my adult privileges

Now we all know there are moments of action and trailblazing and preparedness that children desperately need from their father. However, I believe there are just as many moments when they long for a power from us that comes primarily from our presence; humbling ourselves, like Christ our example, and entering their worlds. You could call it "fathering in the image of God" – the *greatest* Dad ever.

Sometimes, *doing something* for my kids and getting it over with (quickly) so I can get back to what I want to do is nothing more than a broad road to ruin. The narrow road, the one that leads to life, it's not doing anything but *being there*, physically present, and resting in the promise that the Father up above is looking down in love.

Fathers, don't overlook the power of your presence. Power via humility. It doesn't make a lick of worldly sense. But it may just make an eternal difference in the lives of our sons and daughters. Just sit with me dad. It'll only take a minute...

In your relationships with one another, have the same mindset as Christ Jesus:

Who, being in very nature of God, did not consider equality with God something to be used to his own advantage; rather, he made himself nothing by taking the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness.
