As I reflected upon their deaths, I was reminded of how these members made their mark on a congregation. When J.D. Wooten first came to Trinity he literally left his mark. Because the sanctuary was new and large to him, he took a pew pencil and made a small mark under the cap of the pew so he could find the pew on the subsequent Sundays. This, of course, was not the only way J.D. made his mark on the church. Through his encouragement and inspiring attitude, he encouraged us all to love each other and to love the Lord.

Bill Nash, one of our long time members, also went home to be with the Lord this week. Bill and Kathleen have been faithful members of Trinity for many years. In the last few years Bill was unable to attend due to his health, but as I remembered him this week I thought of all of his years of faithful service. Bill found his place in the life of the church being an usher and counting the offerings. Bill's faithfulness, dependability and devotion to our congregation were evident in all that he did around our church.

In these two men I was reminded of why Trinity is such a special place to me. I think how they represent our congregation in its fellowship and mission. One a long time member and another who came in the past decade, yet both finding their place and doing their part to serve the Lord and build up His church.

We each have a place at Trinity. We all have a gift to share and a duty to perform. We each are a part of the Body of Christ and everyone is needed for us to become all that Christ calls us to be.

Where are you serving? What gifts are you offering to the Lord? How are you building up the church and its work? In what ways do you encourage the fellowship of believers at Trinity?

It is my prayer that we all will leave our mark on the lives of those in our congregation. Not necessarily on the pew, but in the hearts of our brothers and sisters in Christ.

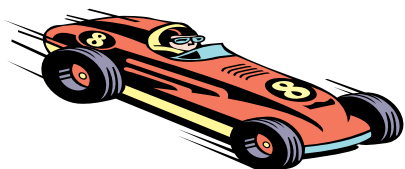

Prayer

Prayer is a pillar of the Lenten observance. It is incredibly important! As I have been preparing for Lent, I have reflected on the many spiritual disciplines. I was reminded of Paul's words to "pray without ceasing."

In one of Paul's letters, he told the Thessalonians to "pray without ceasing." In other words, he told them to pray all the time, all day long. This seems like an awful big job. Unfortunately over the centuries, we have lost sight of his original meaning. Today, the word prayer evokes an image of people on their knees, hands folded, eyes closed, talking to a God who takes requests and turns them into reality. Paul is trying to tell us that we should be living our whole lives as if Jesus is walking next to us.

We can pray in so many ways, even with our eyes open. We can sit by a creek or stream and be quiet, just enjoying the sounds and beauty of the world God made. We can say a quick "thank you" prayer when something happens to us that makes us smile. We can take a deep breath and ask God for

help when we face temptations or are overwhelmed by our circumstances. As you see, our life should be full of prayer.

There is no such thing as unanswered prayer, but sometimes the answer is "not yet" and sometimes "no." Prayer is not about changing God's mind; it is about changing ours. It is bringing our hearts, our desires, and our priorities in line with God's plan. When we are willing to hear what God has to say to us, it changes us. We begin to ask, "What do you want of me, Lord? Speak, for your servant is listening." Prayer prepares us to be the vessels through which God accomplishes His will in the world.

When your children are small, it is often hard to find time to just be still and silent. But Jesus' example shows that the greater our responsibilities, the more we need time to re-focus and seek God in the stillness. This week, commit to spending 5 minutes in silence. It may not seem like prayer, but it is. When we are not distracted, God has our attention and can speak to our hearts.

Reflect on the many forms of prayer and let's put them into practice in our families. Prayer changes things and prayer brings families together centered on God. As you do this and pray for others, don't forget to add flowers and leaves to your Easter tree!
