There is no other day like Easter. As important as Christmas is to all of us it is a non-story without Easter. The resurrection of Jesus places all other the events of Jesus' life into perspective. Because Jesus is raised, His birth becomes significant, as well as the words He spoke and the example He set. Without resurrection, Jesus becomes another one of many of the "messiah figures" that lived and died before and after Jesus.

However, the resurrection transforms not only Jesus' story, but also everything that would precede it and follow it. Jesus' resurrection transforms God's story with God's people prior to Jesus. Now, in retrospect, we can view God's salvation story as a story that was leading to Jesus. God's self revelation through out the Old Testament becomes complete in the person of Jesus. God's character, revealed over time in the Old Testament, is revealed in fullness in Jesus. Jesus would say, "If you have seen me you have seen the Father."

Jesus' resurrection gives relevance to His story. Jesus' claims and actions lack authority without the resurrection. Jesus' resurrection is the proof of His divinity and authority. He truly is who He says He is, the Son of God. Jesus' resurrection lays claim to the future. Because Jesus rose again from the dead, now we know that God is more powerful than the sin, the grave and death itself. Now for those who believe in Jesus and will follow the resurrected one, our ultimate future is certain. We are on our way to God. Jesus said, "I am going to prepare a place for you and if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come to take you to be with Me so you may be where I am."

Because of the resurrection of Jesus, we know that we will have resurrection as well. Because of the resurrection of Jesus, we can even now know the "resurrection power of God" in our lives. We will grieve, but not without hope. We may suffer, but not without comfort. We may struggle, but not without strength. We will sin, but we will be forgiven. We may have questions and acknowledge mystery, but in the mystery there will be an

Easter: The Good News

Celebrate Easter with your family by planting flowers, hiding eggs, walking in a park, reading Bible stories and discovering more about Jesus and His love. Both preschoolers and children can find meaning throughout this season. Jesus is a child's friend. We love to sing songs and tell stories about the good things Jesus went about doing. It is best that preschoolers do not hear the story of the cross in a group setting. But we can share the joy of knowing Jesus as our friend and that he lives forever. Grade Schoolers are better emotionally equipped to handle the fact that Jesus died because of our sin.

As you share with your child, remember to keep Bible content within your child's level of understanding, limited experiences and literal thinking. Discussions regarding Jesus' death and resurrection can be a curiosity as well as an awareness of developing faith. Jesus died a violent and cruel death. It was a murder. We must be careful how this is presented. A good test for parents may be to give as much thought to the presentation of Jesus' death as you would a favorite aunt or grandparent. Would you describe grandma's death to your child using objects hidden in Easter eggs, by beating food, or colored candy and beads? Our relationship with

Christ should be just as real and valid as a family member. We should avoid lessening the respect and love we give Christ or the scriptures.

Unfortunately many well meaning people and products are available which market the Easter season and can sometimes cheapen the message. Focus on the resurrection and the hope we have because Jesus is alive. Our Christian faith is built on this event. It is a sad but necessary thing to say, I had a friend in Jesus, but he died." However, that is not the end of the story. I have a friend in Jesus and Jesus is Alive!
