### Following Jesus...

It is hard to believe that the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship of North Carolina is 20 years. This week in Greensboro at First Baptist Church the organization will celebrate 20 years of ministry. The CBFNC is in many ways the strongest of the state organizations in the CBF community. It was our joy to host this annual meeting just a few years ago and get a first hand view of what God can accomplish when we come together for ministry.

It has been my pleasure to serve over the past year on the 20th Anniversary Visionary Team. This team spent time listening to dreams and concerns of those who comprise the CBFNC. What we learned is that there is high level of trust within the CBFNC between those who lead the organization, its churches, and individuals. The fellowship and support of one another is highly prized. There was also positive feedback regarding the ministries of CBFNC and the mission efforts we undertake together. (Trinity's continued work in Belize is just one of the examples of our ministry alongside CBFNC churches). We also discovered a desire for a clearer vision for the next 20 years.

This coming week, the Visionary Team will present a report on a "way of seeing" and several areas of focus. In regard to a "way of seeing", the team is convinced that in a quickly changing culture what is needed is a "way of seeing" that is more flexible than the traditional visioning and goal setting plans of the past. The vision that is being offered by the team covers three broad ideas. As I have thought about these ideas, I want to offer what I think they mean to me as the Pastor of our congregation. These words are not the exact words of our visioning document but my words as I have considered their meaning for me.

**A Commitment to Transformation:** We want to be agents of God's newness. We want to work with the Spirit of God in the transformation of individuals, churches, and mission collaboration.

**A Commitment to Engagement:** We want to encourage the engagement of individuals and congregations with the world. We want to help congregations live out the greatest command to love the Lord God and to love our neighbor as ourselves.

**A Commitment to Community:** We want to encourage the fellowship of Christians and churches through mission collaboration but also to enter into fellowship and concern with and for one another. We want to have a sense of accountability and concern for all congregations and not just our own.

Alongside these areas of vision, we also developed four areas of focus for the future.

**Empowering Laity for Missional Living:** At the heart of who we are as Baptists is the power and importance of every member. We want to empower all the laity for ministry within and outside the congregation.

**Clarifying Identity and Covenant:** We will seek to help congregations discern, articulate, and renew their covenants, mutual expectations, and promises, which shape their identity and sustain their sense of community. We will clarify the nature of the commitments, which knit together the CBFNC and its mission.

Words from Lydia

In Church history and our early theology from the Church Fathers, there is a Latin phrase that I keep coming back to this Lent—felix culpa. Saint Augustine (354–450AD) wrote of this idea of his gratitude that we should have the privilege of knowing such a great Redeemer in Jesus. Felix means “happy,” “blessed,” “lucky,” or “fortunate,” and culpa means “fault” or “fall.” So, many times it is translated “fortunate fall” or “happy fault.”

During Lent, we spend time thinking about our own sin and the reason for Jesus’ ultimate act of love and sacrifice on the cross. Without the sin of the world, the need for such a Savior would have never existed. This idea of felix culpa seems a bit odd to us at first. It seems that we are celebrating the Fall and our alienation from God. Though we are not to celebrate our sin or sin more so that grace abounds, we must be reminded

that our sin, the sin that nailed Jesus on the cross, also gave us the fortunate, lucky, blessed, and happy chance to know God in this intimate and beautiful way.

As we journey toward the cross over these next few weeks, think on the depth of relationship that we are offered with God because of Jesus’ life, death, and resurrection. Felix culpa is the rejoicing in the relationship we have with God through Jesus. Felix culpa is our Easter story. Jesus showed us God’s love in all of its intensity. He showed us humility. And, he invited us into the intimacy of the Trinity. How fortunate are we that despite our fault we are given the chance to know our Lord.
