Every year as Easter comes and goes, I find myself like the disciples at the tomb wondering "what has happened?". This past Sunday was a tremendous day of worship and fellowship. The energy and joy that filled our Sanctuary was contagious. People lingered for over an hour taking pictures with the flower cross and conversing with many who were "back home" for Easter. Easter really is the most joyous of our Holy Days. Yet, as surely on Friday we say Sunday is coming, on Sunday we know that Monday is coming. The day after the day of rejoicing is going to come and life with its challenges will return.

I am always reminded that one week after Jesus' resurrection the disciples are again gathered in the upper room behind a locked door. A week has passed, they have already seen Jesus, except Thomas, and yet they gather again behind a locked door. The resurrection has come and yet they find themselves where they were before the resurrection. As I consider this scene, I cannot help but think about all the thousands who filled Jerusalem the week of the crucifixion and resurrection. I wonder about all of the reactions of news about Jesus.

I assume there were some who never heard. There were some in Jerusalem the whole time, and for whatever reason they did not hear of the news of the resurrection. There was no social media, no emails, no phone calls to be made. There were thousands who came, enjoyed the festival and left without any knowledge that the world had changed. Today there are billions of people who are yet to hear the gospel of Jesus Christ. Even with all our technology, there are unreached people groups all around the world. They live their lives completely unaware that Jesus is risen and the world has been changed.

There are those who heard, but simply dismissed the story. It was simply an interesting story or tale being circulated. Some I am sure laughed about it, while some probably shook their heads and others may have cursed the story. They may have heard the news but simply passed it off, like any other news we hear, that really has nothing to do with us. All the while, they did not realize that this news was actually about them and God's love for them.

Then there were those who heard it and not only rejected it, but sought to stifle this news. The gospels tell us that the religious leaders went to great lengths to put to end this news that Jesus had risen from the grave. Even after the resurrection and ascension, we find the Chief Priest hard at work arresting and killing those who would testify about "The Way."

On this Monday after Easter, I can't help but wonder where we fit into these responses. How many of us, as we go back to work this week and back to the worries and challenges of life, truly have experienced Easter, the resurrection. Don't dismiss it..the story is for you. Don't reject it...the story is for you. Receive it and let it change your life and don't forget to share with the one who has not heard.
