Joining Hands with God

This past weekend, golf fans watched the defending Master's Champion, Jordan Spieth, have what has been called by some "golf's greatest collapse." Spieth, leading after three days in the tournament, entered the final day with the lead and with every indication that he would repeat as champion. After the first nine holes he held a five-stroke lead. A five-stroke lead by a champion on a difficult course like Augusta National would seem almost insurmountable. However, his "collapse" began on the 10th hole and climaxed on the 12th hole where he scored a 7 on a par 3. In just a few minutes, he went from being a champion and leading to being behind and loosing what seemed impossible to loose just a few minutes before. In very dramatic terms, sports writers are describing it as a "collapse", "disaster," and "unprecedented." One even writes that at the age of 22, Spieth will have to "take this one to his grave."

Interestingly, the Master's Tournament begin on day one with the great golfer Ernie Els missing six putts from three feet away on the first hole. It was like watching a toddler at a miniature golf course trying to putt for the first time. Two great golfers will not be remembered this weekend for playing great, but rather for their failures.

Golf is a fickle sport and for those who play it they know that the difference between jubilation and utter frustration is a fine line. However, golf does teach some valuable lessons and the greatest lesson is perspective. Professional Golfers know:

One hole does not a round make.
One round does not a tournament make.
One tournament does not a year make.
One year does not a career make.
One career does not a life make.

The hardest part for Spieth is the tradition of the past champion placing the green jacket on the new champion. Spieth, at just 22, had to gather himself and participate in the crowning of a new champion after his great moment of failure. He did so with grace and maturity.

As I have read about Jordan Spieth and his "collapse" at the Masters, I have thought about we can choose to be defined by our failures or we can choose to be defined about by

what is still possible. Spieth will play again and he will probably win the Masters again if not many times again. We too must choose not to be defined by failure, but by what God has for our future. When we are tempted to be defined by failure and not possibilities let us remember the words of the Apostle Paul:

I'm not saying that I have this all together, that I have it made. But I am well on my way, reaching out for Christ, who has so wondrously reached out for me. Friends, don't get me wrong: By no means do I count myself an expert in all of this, but I've got my eye on the goal, where God is beckoning us onward—to Jesus. I'm off and running, and I'm not turning back. Philippians 4:12-14 from The Message:

Have you failed? Own up to it and confess it to God and to another if need be. But don't linger there long and let it define you. Let us be "off and running and not turning back" to the possibilities that God has for each of us.
