Joining Hands with God

In 1 Timothy 5:1-2, Paul gives these instructions to the young pastor Timothy.

Don't be harsh or impatient with an older man. Talk to him as you would your own father, and to the younger men as your brothers. Reverently honor an older woman as you would your mother, and the younger women as sisters.

Paul is instructing Timothy to treat people in the congregation like family. In a church culture that might be situated in a small town, rural village or even just a smaller congregation, the concept of "family" is easier to maintain. However, in a large metropolitan church like Trinity the concept of family is harder to grasp. As our church continues to change, the challenge to know one another and feel a sense of connection is a growing concern. Many of us would admit that at church we have several good friends and then we have acquaintances. And a much larger number of people we don't know with whom we share a common experience we call Trinity. In a changing and busy culture the idea of the church as family is rapidly disappearing.

Yet, the New Testament uses the terms of family to describe the relationship we are to seek with one another. We are to view one another as brothers and sisters in Christ. In Paul's terms, we are to treat those who are older like beloved parents and those younger like brothers and sisters. Paul gives us some insight in how this occurs in the church. We are not to have an attitude of honor. To honor someone is to hold them in high regard. Paul says we are to honor those older than us like we would our parents. Paul assumes that a person would honor their natural parents since this is one of the 10 commandments. We are instructed to honor our father and mother and thus we now expand that attitude toward others in the congregation. To honor someone does not mean you "do as they say". In fact, Timothy is told to exhort those who are older. Timothy, as a young pastor, is to encourage those who are older to Christ like living but to do so with a proper attitude.

In addition, we are instructed to treat those who are younger like brothers and sisters. Notice Paul does not say to treat them as children. To treat them as children belittles their place in regards to their opinions and gifts they have to offer now in the life of the church. As you can see, Paul is instructing us to have a certain attitude toward others in the congregation and that attitude is honor, respect and care.

One of our core values is Fellowship. In this core value, we state that Fellowship is intentional. In other words, we will not just "become" family without some effort. We must value this Biblical teaching enough to create family. There are many ways we can do this.

The Great Spiritual Migration

When Jesus saw this, be was indignant. He said to them, "Let the children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these." – Mark 10:14

The past week I attended a conference in Chicago called Faith Forward. It is an ecumenical gathering of ministers/clergy and lay leadership with a focus toward youth and children's ministry of the future. Some questions we addressed were: How are the elders of our congregations to relate to the next generation? How are we including them in the worship and leadership of the church? What is our response to the violence and segregation of our society? Brian McLaren, a pastor, speaker, public theologian, ecumenical networker, and activist, is the think tank personality behind this movement. He offers a keen perspective on the future of church as well as Christianity itself.

Here is one thought. Christianity is one generation away from extinction or one generation away from regeneration. Will our churches become the empty tourist attractions like in Europe? Or will we be able to include and encourage our young to own their faith and live it out as an adult? Revitalization is growing up around us with our children.

Brian dared to ask, "What would it mean if I were to say—forget about medium and older adults and focus on youth and children. Dare to propose that Christianity is run by youth

on mission." Of course, this is not realistic but it does offer the challenge to go beyond providing "wholesome" activities for our children/youth but to really engage them in society and the church so they own their part in the experience of faith.

His new book is titled, *The Great Spiritual Migration: How the world's largest religion is seeking a better way to be Christian* suggests the following:

People by the millions are migrating out of traditional religion - some into secularism, some into experimental forms of nonreligious spirituality. But even within religious communities, people are on the move, migrating in exciting new directions. Brian D. McLaren challenges Christians to embark on a great spiritual migration: to seize this dynamic moment as an opportunity for Christian faith to become more just, generous, and joyful - and therefore more truly Christian.

I have a hope for the future and a deep desire to include our children in the all aspects of church and worship. Join me in the journey with the next generation.

Much of adult learning is by means of words the symbols by which we are able to communicate. However learning in preschool years is different than learning in adult years.
