### **Church Conference Update:**

In our April Church Conference, the following decisions and information was shared:

- We welcomed 17 new members this past month to Trinity Baptist Church.
- A Welcome Team is being formed to study and help coordinate our ability to welcome our guests throughout the time of our morning worship services and Sunday School. Johnny Teal and Bill Johnston will help coordinate this effort.
- The Facilities Master Planning Committee informed the congregation that contractor Clancy and Theys has been chosen to assist us in pre-construction services. In addition, a construction sub-committee to assist our contractor on daily decisions was formed and approved by the congregation. This committee is comprised of Shannon Rouse, John Witcher, George Mathis and Miller Warren.
- The church voted to provide classroom space, this summer, to provide training for potential foster parents in the Raleigh area.
- The Deacons recommended and the church approved that Carla Babb be recommended to the Raleigh Baptist Association Ordination Council for the purpose of seeking ordination.
- The Nominating Committee report was presented and approved.
- The Financial Report was presented approved. At the end of the first quarter the church is over \$16,000 receipts over expenses.
- North Raleigh Ministries reported that 34
  families were provided with Easter Baskets


