This coming Sunday we will celebrate the graduation of our High School Seniors, as well as those who will have graduated from college and earned other degrees. This time of celebration is always an important moment not only for our graduates and their families, but also for us as a congregation. Much of what we do as an intergenerational congregation, or as we like to refer to it a "family of faith", is to celebrate and participate in moments of transition in the lives of those we share life with at Trinity. It begins when a child is born and visits from ministers, deacons and Sunday School Class members remind this family they have someone praying and supporting them. It continues in a Parent/Child Dedication where parents and the church give thanks to God for the life of a child and promise to do all they can for this child to be taught about Jesus and to lead this child to faith.

Later, the church gives the child a Bible to read as they enter into the Children's Ministry. As they transition into Middle School and High School, the church educates parents and students about the changes they are going to face physically, emotionally and spiritually. We pray that somewhere along the way through the conviction of the Holy Spirit and the free will choice of a child, they make a decision to follow Jesus and make a public profession of their faith and are baptized as an outward acknowledgement that they are going to follow Jesus.

In their years of growing up, the children at Trinity will have the opportunity to learn about Jesus, go on mission trips, attend camps, sing and lead in worship, and through weekly activities become an integral part of our congregation.

Graduation Day is another of these moments of transition, which we share with these now young adults. We have watched them grow, mature and change right before our eyes. In just a few short months many will be off to college, some off to work, and others to the military. Life for most will be different. They will not have someone looking over them every moment of the day, which they of course welcome but sometimes miss. They will have to find their own way when it comes to eating, sleeping, exercising, socializing and of course worshipping. It is our prayer that they



N.C. Transportation Museum, Spencer Mills Home for Children, Thomasville

Tuesday, June 10 • 8:00 am - 7:00 pm

Cost: \$15 for admission, train ride and gas, plus meals: fast food breakfast, lunch at Hendrix BBQ, dinner at K&W

Limited to 30 Seats

We'll travel to Spencer for a guided tour of the 57-acre site, with a 25-minute train ride pulled by an antique diesel engine. This was once Southern Railroad's largest steam locomotive repair facility on the east coast. The 37-stall Bob Julian Roundhouse, one of the largest ever built, was constructed in 1924. It is one of the few preserved roundhouses remaining in the country and houses about 40 restored locomotives and rail cars. Though known for its trains, the museum also holds one of the last remaining 1910 Buick automobiles in the country and the Melville Dairy Wagon, part of the fleet of six wagons used in Burlington during World War II to conserve gasoline to aid in wartime efforts. The Bumper to Bumper exhibit is an impressive collection of antique automobiles ranging from a 1901 White Steam Stanhope to a 1978 Plymouth N.C. Highway Patrol car. Finally, there is a full size replica Wright Flyer on loan from the Wright Brothers National Memorial.

On the way back to Raleigh, we'll stop in Thomasville for a brief tour of the Mills Home, the original Baptist Children's Home.

Join us for this exciting day. It includes a good bit of walking, but wheel chairs are available when reserved in advance. 
