Joining Hands with God

I was on vacation when I learned of the shooting in Orlando. To be honest I was trying to disconnect from normal news cycle and focus on my family, but if we have learned anything lately it is that you cannot escape the violence and hatred that seems to permeate our culture. This horrific incident will again divide people. There will be debates about gun control, immigration, Is-lam, and the LBGT community.

As I consider all of the complexities of this tragic event, I am at a lost for words. How do we begin to comprehend such violence? How do we begin to understand such hatred? How do we begin to contemplate any solution to these complex issues? I find myself very leery of those who seem to have all the answers to these complex issues. I am reminded of those in Jeremiah 6:14, which reads "They dress the wound of my people as though it were not serious. Peace, peace, they say, when there is no peace."

What are we to do? Let me suggest that we spend some time grieving. What would it be like if those who followed Jesus refrained this week from offering answers and did not even pose questions, but simply took time to grieve? What if we were to grieve like parents who lost children? What if we were to grieve like siblings who lost siblings? What if we were to grieve like grandparents whose grandchild was clinging to life in a hospital? What if we were to grieve our loss of innocence, of feeling safe and any hope of life being like it use to be? What if we were to just grieve?

I think grief calls us to tears not fears. I think grief begs for more time in prayer and less time in debate. Grief requires less talking and more silence.

What if this week we grieved? I know there are those who think now is the time to speak. They will argue there has been too much silence. We all must do what we feel called to

do in such moments. I respect others and I will let them speak. However, I am going to choose to grieve and do so quietly. Instead of speaking, I am going to sit in the ashes. Like Job and his friends who sat in the ashes for seven days and nights because of the difficulty of life, I think a week to grieve might be the best course of action. In the silence and the ashes, I am going to listen. I am going to listen for God to speak beyond the noise and the news cycle. I am going to listen for a voice of comfort, peace and hope. I am going to choose to believe that our God is always at work in the midst of some of the most horrible situations. I am not going to tell God what God should do, nor even ask God to act. I am going to grieve quietly and believe God is acting and speaking. Yes, I am going to grieve and listen. I am going to grieve with the hope others will join me. For grief is easier when others share it with us. What if, at least for this week, as God's people we just grieved?

This coming Sunday, we will continue our series on People Jesus Met as we consider "The Forgotten One." I am looking forward to our time of worship.

I couldn't help to reflect on the hymn we opened worship with this past Sunday,

"We Are God's People" as I though through the process of moving to the ROC for worship when the construction begins at Trinity. This hymn stood out to me kind of like a rallying cry for us as the body of Christ coming together during this time of change in the infrastructure with which we are so familiar. There are many other hymns that speak about unity as believers, but I thought as we were singing Sunday that I would look into a little more about the writer and this hymn set to Brahms' tune SYMPHONY.

Rev. Bryan Jeffery Leech was a pastor originally from England who came to the United States in 1955. He wrote as many as 500 songs, hymns, cantatas and anthems. He composed this hymn on July 4, 1975, which is especially interesting when pondering unity as a nation as well as unity in the church. The hymn is based on the scripture

The body is a unit, though it is made up of many parts;

And though all its parts are many, they form one body.

So it is with Christ.

- 1 Corinthians 12:12

So, as we look ahead in the future months of our church under construction, it will be easy to think we are somewhat disjointed, disconnected, and even scattered at times. But, we must remember that our unity is of the heart spiritually where the body may feel broken at times. 

VBS MISSION PROJECT: Disaster Relief Comfort Kits

Response is often needed quickly in the aftermath of a disaster like a hurricane. In keeping with our "Surf—Beach" theme, we are choosing a project that might help victims of a hurricane. Various Baptist Conventions and other Baptist Men's organizations could take comfort kits to children that are victims of a disaster. This year we are collecting items for a Child's comfort kit or a Baby comfort kit. We are providing gallon size zip-loc bags to use for the kits. We ask that you choose four items from the list below, mark the age on the provided form and mark the possible gender then return the sealed kit to VBS or SS.

Age breakdowns are as follows:

Baby: 0-3 months, 3-6 months, 6-9 months, 9-12 months, 12-18 months, 18-24 months

Child Package: 2-3 years, 4-5 years, 6-7 years, 8-9 years, 10-12 years

Needs List: Choose 4 Items to include in your gallon bag.

Baby: Diaper, Baby nail clippers, Sippy Cup, Pacifier, Diaper Shirt, Handi-wipes, small soft washable toy or soft book.

Child: New Small Stuffed animal, Wash Cloth, doll, books, puzzles, small games, Colors/ coloring book, Small toy (age appropriate—cars for boys, etc.), comb/brush

For all kits: Bibles and small notes are always welcomed.
