Joining Hands with God

Last week, I shared with you information about the meeting of the Southern Baptist Convention. This past week, I attended the 2016 Assembly of the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship in Greensboro. This is always a great time for me personally, as I get the opportunity to see so many friends from seminary and other states where I have served. I always think the relationships are the best part of the CBF Assembly. I was also proud of several actions initiated by the Fellowship this year. To understand CBF you have to first understand that unlike the Southern Baptist Convention, the CBF is not a denomination. CBF is a partnership of churches, individuals and ministry organizations who have covenanted together to do ministry together. The CBF's major reason for existence is to create a partnership for global missions. To achieve the goal of global missions, CBF partners with Baptist Unions and Organizations all over the world.

In my opinion there were two important initiatives undertaken this year by the CBF. The first one was to adjust its model for funding full time missionaries. At a time when many mission organizations are moving to self funding or short term missionaries, the CBF is choosing to make the presence of long term resident missionaries a priority. The CBF believes that the transformation of the gospel in communities and with people groups all over the world require a long term presence. The presence of a missionary who lives with the people and builds relationships and proclaims the gospel message is still the best model for ministry. To this end, the CBF adopted a new funding process where every missionary will receive equitable support. In addition, the new model will seek to give local churches the opportunity to help fund ministry and programs of our long term missionaries. In this model, two things are important for a local church like Trinity. First, our gifts to Global Missions Offering is of utmost importance in keeping missionaries on the field. Second, we must continue to send our own short-term mission teams to partner with CBF field personnel. In recent years, our work in Belize and in McCreary County, Kentucky are great examples of our short-term teams partnering with CBF Partnerships.

Another initiative I am proud of CBF to undertake is called the Illumination Project. The Illumination Project is a process which will guide the CBF through cultural and theological differences that might cause disunity in our partnerships. Since the CBF is not a denomination, it does not require uniformity when it comes to it's partnering churches. Our unity is found in our willing cooperation with one another. Celebrating the autonomy

of the local church, CBF churches are diverse in certain practices of faith. These differences might range from who the church chooses to ordain, a church's ministry partners, or requirements of baptism and membership, to a church's view on more culturally divisive issues. The Illumination Project is a process to help CBF continue to value unity through cooperation and a global mission with global mission partners.

As I thought about the Illumination Project, I thought about Trinity Baptist Church. As I look out each Sunday, I see our wonderful and unique membership. I sometimes wonder how we, as a church, have found such unity in our diversity. On each pew in worship and in each Sunday School class there are those who disagree on almost every major cultural issue of our day. In our study of God's word we celebrate different interpretations, meaningful conversation and dialogue. Yet, we are united in ministry. Why? We are committed to the Lordship of Jesus. We believe the Bible is our authority for the practice of faith and we are committed to study it and choose obedience to its instruction. We are committed to love each other above all else. We are convinced we should love those who are not a part of our church as our neighbors. Our unity at Trinity is no great secret. It is the result of being a faithful to Jesus and to one another.

It has worked for Trinity. I am convinced it will work for CBF. Our world is in desperate need for us to bear witness to the risen Christ. There is too much at stake for us not to do it together.

Words from Karen



Disaster Relief: Children's Comfort Kits

During VBS we started collecting comfort kits for children in preparation for the aftermath of a disaster like a hurricane. Various Baptist Conventions and other Baptist Men's organizations could take comfort kits to children that are victims of a disaster. This year we are collecting items for a Child's comfort kit or a Baby comfort kit. We are providing gallon size ziploc bags to use for the kits. (We ask that you choose four items from the list below, mark the age on the provided form and mark the possible gender then return the sealed kit to VBS or SS.

Age breakdowns are as follows:

Baby: 0-3 months, 3-6 months, 6-9 months, 9-12 months, 12-18 months, 18-24 months

Child Package: 2-3 years, 4-5 years, 6-7 years, 8-9 years, 10-12 years

Needs List: Choose 4 Items to include in your gallon bag.

Baby: diaper, baby nail clippers, sippy cup, pacifier, diaper shirt, handi-wipes, small soft washable toy or soft book.

Child: new small stuffed animal, wash cloth, doll, books, puzzles, small games, colors/coloring book, small toy (age appropriate—cars for boys, etc.), comb/brush

For all kits: Bibles and small notes are always welcomed.

We appreciate all who choose to help with this ministry. What a fun way to be proactive before a disaster happens. Just look for the extra forms around on the grade school hallway or in the church office. Feel free to grab a gallon size bag and bring it with you to to church for collection!
