This past Sunday night, we met for our July Church Conference and the following agenda items were discussed and approved:

By the recommendation of the Personnel Committee, Rev. Lydia Tatum will assume the duties of leading the Student Ministry during the interim period and will receive additional compensation during this time. The church voted to hire Mr. Christian Davis as an interim Student Ministry Associate. Christian has served as our intern over the past year. Christian, who will begin Campbell Divinity School in August, will work 25 hours a week in this position. A Transition Team for Student Ministry was approved to make recommendations to the Personnel Committee and the Church in establishing the staff needs and candidates for these positions in regards to our Student Ministry. This team consists of two Personnel Committee members, Michael Coats and Kay Bailey, and four Student Ministry Committee members, Stephanie Tepper, Jeff Smith, Tonya Zucker and Shelia Baldwin.

Our Treasurer, Jody Joyner, recommended a change in our credit card usage and policy that will allow the church to participate in rewards system through Wells Fargo Bank, which would grant the church such rewards as air miles and other benefits that can be used for mission trips and other ministry needs. Our current credit card plan did not include a reward system.

The church also heard reports from the Belize Medical Mission Team and the Nashville High School Mission Team. The Nominating Committee Report was approved and the congregation also reviewed the Financial Report.



Remembering Ed...

Rarely do you meet such a unique individual as Ed DePiazzy, let alone become his friend. Ed passed away two weeks ago. He was living in a nursing home in Wake Forest at the time, but had been at Capital Towers before that. TBC members who got to know him heard a lot about duck farming - a profession he did on an industrial scale on Long Island, NY for many years. Ed was also an inventor – constantly coming up with ideas not only for duck farming (of which he held several patents), but things that he dreamed up that would help others. He was always thinking – and watching. When he saw national guard soldiers filling sand bags with shovels before Hurricane Katrina, he designed a machine that could sit on the back of a flat bed truck that could be moved into place

But Ed was also lonely. He had no children from his marriage to his wife of many years before she died. His siblings have passed away and only one had a child – a niece that he knew in Pennsylvania. TBC was his family. He would regularly drop by the office to get to know the support staff, and would come on into my office just to talk awhile. He went with us on a Honduras Mission around 11 years ago and used a block saw cutting cement blocks to build a church most all week. He attended regularly until his hearing got so bad that he could not understand his Sunday School teacher, Dr. Roberts, or the people he sat at dinner with on Wednesday nights. He was embarrassed.

My friend, Ed is already in heaven. His earthly body is in a funeral home on Long Island. I will go next week and fulfill a promise I made to him. I will have a graveside service and witness his burial beside his first wife and his mother and father. I look forward to seeing this island that he loved so much...and maybe even visit a duck farm. He would like to have given me a tour, I'm sure. I'll miss you, friend. - Hal

- A fever (100 degrees or more in the armpit, 101 degrees orally, or 102 degrees rectally). Child should be fever free for 24 hours
- Diarrhea
- Severe coughing
- Two or more episodes of vomiting within the past 12 hours
- Red eye with white or yellow eye discharge, until 24 hours after treatment
- Yellow or green nasal discharge
