In 1996, then First Lady Hillary Clinton wrote a book entitled "It Takes a Village." She adopted an African Proverb, which comes from many African cultures, that essentially suggests that every child not only is raised by their parents but also there are others of great significance in the raising of a child. For many of us, we not only had parents who loved us and taught us, we also had grandparents, aunts, uncles, coaches, teachers, preachers and neighbors that became as family to us. Most of us can recall individuals, beyond our parents, who have had a lasting influence on us.

Because my parents were followers of Jesus they thought it was important for me to be a part of a church family. So, no matter where we lived we found a church and became active. When I was a young boy my family was a part of a church start in Louisville, Kentucky. A young doctoral student at Southern Seminary by the name of Peter Rhea Jones led this small congregation. Dr. Jones later became a renowned New Testament professor and then long time pastor of the First Baptist Church of Decatur, Georgia. Even now as an adult all these years later I am blessed to know Dr. Jones and his family. In Reynoldsburg, Ohio we were part of a small Baptist church for 5 years. In our first week in our new home, my Father had already scoped out several of the Baptist churches (it did not take that long there were only three) and made a decision where we would worship on our first Sunday in Ohio. We soon joined that church and it is where I made my profession of faith as a young boy. I can still recall the names of the men who taught R.A.'s and those who served as deacons with my Father. My Mother is still friends with many of those who were a part of that congregation.

When we moved back to Knoxville, Tennessee and I began Middle School we returned to our home congregation and there for my teen years not only a church family but also many of my own biological family surrounded me. It is impossible for me to share with you how much they are interwoven into my story and developed my character. My parents raised me, and I am grateful for their love and involvement. However, others have influenced me as well.

Each time I walk a newborn up and down the aisle of Trinity Baptist Church we make a commitment to young parents that we as a church will be a part of their lives and this newborn's life. In fact, the commitment litany says "Trinity Baptist Church realizes that in a sense this is your child too." This is a time of commitment and a moment when we become accountable to one another.



In art, the concept of whitespace is not simply blank space, but it is a space necessary for a composition to exist – to live and breathe and have depth. The whitespace in a piece of artwork is often more important to the pulse of the piece than any one stroke of the brush. It provides balance and a sense of place. It grounds the piece.

We, the work of the Master's hands, need whitespace. We need to be grounded, and we need space to breathe and live and move. During the fall, the student ministry takes time to invite our students to retreat - to take a step back from school, homework, sports, and everyday life in order that they might reconnect with God in the whitespace that retreating provides. But, what about the rest of us? What about parents who are overworked, overstressed, and over-scheduled? Where is your whitespace?

How do you vary prayer experiences for a young child?

At Mealtimes

- An adult may begin the prayer and ask the child/children to complete the prayer. Dear God, we thank you today for "_____". Each person at the table names one or more things he/she is thankful for.
- Precede the verbalized prayer with a song such as "God is so Good".
- Ask one at the table to pray, expressing gratitude for specific things rather than saying a memorized prayer. Memorized prayers stifle one's expression of personal feelings.
- Say or read a Bible verse before the prayer.
- Tell one good thing that happened during the day before the blessing at the evening meal.

At Bedtime or Other Times

- Tell or read a simple Bible story before the prayer experience.
- Ask the child to name one thing or person he/she is thankful for and one thing he/she wants to ask God.
- Point out ways God has helped family members and others during the day.

- Recall some simple Bible verses learned at church and at home.
