Deepen The Ties That Bind

This coming Sunday, I will conclude our series on "Essential Faith." In our sermon series from Hebrews we have discovered the importance of faith. We have been reminded that faith is essential if we want to please God. We have learned that faith enables us to view the world from God's perspective. We have learned that faith allows us to endure hardship in life and to view hardship as moments of spiritual growth. We have been reminded that faith must be expressed in our relationship with others and with God. We are to make every effort in living in peace with others and we are to not be ruled by impulse, but rather by faith in God. This week, we will conclude our series with the "Exhortations of Faith" from Hebrews 13.

The very first exhortation is to "keep on loving each other." The very nature of this exhortation reminds us that love is a choice and sometimes it takes effort. The love mentioned in Hebrews 13 is not simply an emotion. It is the choice of good will and wanting what is best for others in our lives. This is especially true when it comes to brothers and sisters in Christ.

All of us have people in our lives who we feel are easy to love. Then there are others, due to conflict or even just personality differences, we find hard to love. However, the kind of love that we are exhorted to display is not based on how we might "feel" about the other person. Instead, it is based on our faith in God and the knowledge that God loves us, as well as other person. So, as we conclude our series, I want to exhort you, even as the writer of Hebrews has, "keep on loving each other."

How can we practice this on a personal basis? First, put the needs of others before your own. As we share life together in the church, we must always think of the needs of others that are around us. Second, pray for one another. Spend time daily praying for those in our church who are struggling, or those who are sick and hurting. Pray for the marriages in your Sunday School class, and for the children and youth in our congregation. Embrace "your church" with love and lift them up to God. Third, speak words of encouragement. We all need to hear words of encouragement, and when it is spoken in love... it can make a person's day.

As I write this article, I am aware of how much I love our church and how this exhortation is practiced in our congregation. However, we must not grow complacent in our lives together. It is my prayer that everyone who comes through the doors of Trinity Baptist Church knows they are loved, cared for and prayed for. Let's make sure that no one is left out. Let us "keep on loving each other."

While we ourselves may be sleepy on Sunday morning maybe we too should think about the positive reasons we go to church and make a point to share that with our children. Remember, children mirror what we show them.
- We also need to pray together as a family often, listening to the personal prayers of each family member.
- As a family we should talk more openly about God as a loving network of kindness, empathy and forgiveness in ways that children can understand and comprehend.
- We should attend church as regularly as possible and combine it with other fun family activities, like trips to a new park, picking up donuts or going to the zoo. It's like I wrote about a few weeks ago; create family traditions that your children look forward to.
