Chap Clark began his sermon, this past week, with the question of "what type of church do we long to be?" In his sermon he spoke of a very powerful man who got down on his knees and engaged a child in conversation. Dr. Clark illustrated for us, a congregation, where we all find ourselves in the same place. We all are debtors forgiven by God. This fall, I have been preaching on the church. My series is entitled "It Takes a Church" and we have considered how a church needs to be accountable to God and each other, accepting of each other and how a church is only as strong as our willingness to be servants.

This week, we turn our attention to the idea of process. We sometimes forget that a church is not a static institution. The church is always changing. It is a living organism and not a dead organization. The local church only exists to the extent that we exist within it and choose to be a part of it. Since we as human beings are always in process, thus the church is also always in process and change. As human beings we go through some changes that are rapid and others that are hardly noticeable, but we change. We can watch a 9th grade boy grow several inches in just a few months. The change is rapid and evident to all. We sadly watch ones we love go through disease and witness rapid weight loss and weakness. Sometimes a very vibrant person is rapidly reduced to noticeable weakness by diseases.

Then there are those changes that are so slow and gradual. How many times do we see a picture of ourselves and in that moment realize we have aged? How many times has a certain glance in the mirror revealed another sign of the aging process? Sometimes we are shocked to see ourselves as we really are. Change comes to us physically.

In the same way we experience change in every area of life. There are sudden and gradual changes professionally, personally and spiritually. In Philippians 3, the Apostle Paul speaks of the changes that God is bringing to his life. He writes:

"Not that I have already obtained all this, (the power of the resurrection) or have already been made perfect, but I press on to take hold of that for which Christ Jesus took hold of me.... forgetting what is behind and straining toward what is ahead, I press on toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenward in Christ Jesus."

Words from Christian

When I was about 14 or 15, my dad and I were going to help with the Special Needs Ministry that met during the 11 o'clock service at my home church. I was excited because I was going to be able to help out with a new ministry and play with kids.

All was going well until my father asked me to pop a bag of popcorn for the kids. As I had done the other countless times I made popcorn, I put the bag in the microwave and pushed the popcorn button. After what was no more than a minute, I began to smell that dreaded smell of burning popcorn. So, I quickly opened the microwave and the bag only to find a bag full of black popcorn, which I proceeded to throw in the trashcan not thinking anything of it.

I will never forget the sounds that followed... First was the fire alarm. After hearing this, I ran back to my dad to say, "It wasn't me!" Minutes later was the sound of a number of foot steps, which were either coming from the firemen or the congregation evacuating the sanctuary. Needless to say, I was too nervous to go upstairs and find out.

Even now, (ten years later) Brian will still stop me in the hallway at church to ask me if I have cooked any popcorn lately. I am truly thankful for the friendship and fellowship that resulted from that day.

The Lord is at work in the oddest of situations. At the time, the situation was just stressful and embarrassing. There are a lot of days where we walk through life stressed and embarrassed; yet when we set our eyes on Christ, we see that the Lord is constantly at work. As we go through the week, we should look for God to show up in these unexpected places and situations. You will be surprised to find the blessings that come out of these odd situations.


Peru Mission Work Days



When to Keep Preschoolers Home

- A fever (100 degrees or more in the armpit, 101 degrees orally, or 102 degrees rectally). Child should be fever free for 24 hours.
- Diarrhea
- · Severe coughing
- Two or more episodes of vomiting within the past 12 hours
- Red eye with white or yellow eye discharge, until 24 hours after the treatment
- Yellow or green nasal discharge
