Deepen The Ties That Bind

One of our core values at Trinity is "Fellowship." In our Intentionality Statements we state "Trinity Baptist Church values genuine fellowship, which is intentional and produces unity and harmony in the church family, the body of Christ." When I have had conversations with church members concerning this core value, I have discovered two important characteristics about our congregation. The first one is people believe there is a healthy sense of fellowship in our congregation. When members choose to be involved with a Sunday School class or other small group they feel welcomed, accepted and develop a sense of community. However, a second characteristic is that most members tell me that this sense of community is not as strong when they consider the whole of the congregation. In a large church, it is hard to develop community beyond the individuals in one's Sunday School class or outside a particular ministry team. Yet, we believe at Trinity that the church should be intergenerational and we should seek community throughout the whole of the congregation.

There are several instances where this cross-generational fellowship occurs naturally. The music ministry is a good example. The church members who sing in the choir or play in the orchestra or Bells of Praise, have a natural time of gathering, a common purpose and can build community. There are mission teams that also have the same opportunities. It is true to say that there are many opportunities for us to build cross-generational fellowship from week-to-week. However, because this core value is so important we also must be intentional to create more opportunities.

This is the reason for 4X4 fellowship groups. This summer we registered to be a part of a 4X4 group. These fellowship groups will consist of members of various ages and life situations. As part of one of these groups, you are encouraged to meet four times in a year for a meal and fellowship.

If you registered to be a part of a group, you should receive in the mail this week a letter that will contain information about your group and how to get started. If, for some reason, you registered and do not receive the information, please contact the church office so we can make sure you are part of a group. If you missed registration and would like to be placed in a group, then let us know and we will continue to form groups, until the first of the year.

What is Worship to You?

Worship involves encountering the Lord, meeting Jesus, hearing God's word and lifting our voices in praise. Worship is not just a refueling time to get us through another week. It is not a system of traditions built up over the years of congregational life until we feel comfortable. It is also not a time to unwind, relax, take a mental vacation and enjoy an hour of Christian entertainment.

Worship should be the surrender of our souls to a God who is jealous for our attention, time and love. Worship is a challenge. With children it is a bigger challenge. Like most sports or activities children participate in, they learn by doing, practicing and experiencing. Children learn to worship by worshipping—through participation, practice, and patience. The task can be overwhelming if you take it seriously. Training children to worship is best taught by parents or the significant caregivers in their life, not necessarily professionals.

Worshipping parents in the pew can show by example what it means to seek God, to love God's Son, and to respond to the Holy Spirit in worship. Children learn that prayer

How to Make Worship Meaningful for your Child

- 1. Show excitement when picking up your child to go to the worship service. Help them to anticipate the hour. You might say, "We are going to worship God," or "Let's go see what we are singing today," or "We are going to meet God."
- 2. Introduce your child to various ministers, leaders, ushers, and other church helpers. They will be learning about church helpers all year. Watch for them in the service.
- 3. Encourage your child to participate. Stand up when everyone stands, sing along, follow the words, look up scripture and point to it, and give an offering when the plate is past.

- 4. Sit close enough so your child can see. Many will sit more still when they are able to see and hear best.
- 5. Don't be afraid of the wiggles or questions. It will only bother you for a while. This is a learning time—you will not get this year back. Those around you will understand more than you know.
- 6. Take the next few weeks to get used to the transition. Attend worship together one week and maybe let your child remain in ETC for another.
- 7. Sign up to work in ETC or volunteer in church somewhere as a family. Let your child see how important church involvement is to your family. Set the example. They are learning what church is all about.
- 8. Don't fret if your child falls asleep or doodles while the service if going on. Children can multitask very well. They are still learning and sharing in the worship experience. How often does your mind travel even in an upright position?
- 9. As you enter, pick up a children's worship bulletin or the worship notebook and the regular one. Discuss the difference and the importance of following along and participating.

We are thankful and excited to have families with us at Trinity. My prayer is that at Trinity, you can grow as a family in your relationship with Christ
