Deepen The Ties That Bind

This past week, you should have received a copy of the 2017 budget proposal, as well as a letter from our “Deepen The Ties that Bind” Capital Campaign. As you can see, our Finance Committee has been hard at work with our committees and program leaders to propose a budget for the coming year. We will be discussing this budget this coming Sunday evening, October 16, in our regular Church Conference at 7:00 p.m. in the Chapel. If no amendments are offered, we will vote on approving this budget on Sunday, October 23 in both worship services.

In addition to our regular giving, you have done an outstanding job in keeping us up to date in our Capital Campaign. I want to encourage you to keep up your pledge. If you have not made a pledge or a contribution to our Capital Campaign, then I encourage you to do so.

In our time of transition and building, our giving is another example of our church’s faithfulness. I am so thankful, as your pastor, to constantly be amazed at our congregation’s generosity and stewardship. We must always remember that we give not simply to support a budget or build a building, but we give because we can show our love for the Lord and the Kingdom of God through our giving.

As you consider our budget and campaign, I hope you will prayerfully consider your giving to the work of the Lord here at Trinity. The Bible teaches us to tithe or give 10% of our money to the Lord. The tithe is an acknowledgement of giving first to God. Tithing not only honors God, but also guards our hearts from greed. We remember through the tithe that all we have is a gift from God. We are also called to give sacrificially. The Capital Campaign gives us an opportunity to give above our tithe. The Campaign offers us an opportunity to be directly involved in what is happening in our congregation.

I view our 2017 Budget and our Capital Campaign as more than a necessary act of being a part of the church. I believe it is a way to worship, give thanks, and participate in what God is doing in us and through us. I hope that you will continue your faithful stewardship and let us all remember that God loves a “cheerful” giver.

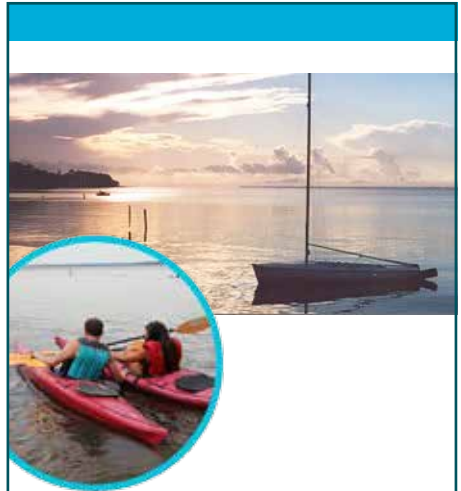

Prayer: Your Personal War Room

Prayer is at the very core of a personal relationship with Jesus Christ. Why? Prayer is a conversation with God. How can you maintain a relationship with someone you never talk to? Yet many people misunderstand prayer. When they think of prayer, they think of a pastor praying a lengthy, well-worded, well-organized prayer. They do not think of prayer as a dialogue with another person.

Some people are intimidated to pray out loud with others. This uncomfortable feeling can directly affect whether you pray at home with your family. It can also affect how you pray and how often you pray at home.

You would think that people who love God and have a definite belief in the saving, sustaining power of Jesus Christ would not have difficulty talking to Him. Yet George Barna, a leading marketing researcher on the intersection of faith and culture in America discovered that in a typical week, fewer than 10 percent of parents who regularly attend church with their kids read the Bible

together, pray together (other than at meal times) or participate in an act of service as a family unit.

Sunday nights this fall have been set aside for a focus on prayer. We watched the movie "War Room" together. We join together for study and on Oct. 2 we had our first prayer walk with 8 meaningful prayer stations set up for participants to experience. It was amazing to watch and experience. I am so thankful for Angela Strickland and her vision to call our church to prayer and her effort toward unique prayerful experiences. Stay tuned for a Prayer Workshop (Oct.23) led by Dr. Roberts and another Prayer Walk (Nov.6).
