1st Grade Bible Presentation

All 1st graders will be presented a Bible from the church during this worship service. It is a wonderful opportunity for our church to show support and leadership in spiritual nurturing.

Baptism and Lord's Supper to a Young Child

Because of a young child's curiosity, she naturally will be very interested in baptism and the Lord's Supper. The impact of these events often is underscored by the music, lighting, "costumes," number of participants, and words spoken. The drama accompanying these activities usually prompts questions, also.

When a child asks questions during a worship service, whisper a brief answer to her, but tell her that you will talk about it again after church. Then **remember to talk with her as soon as possible**. Questions do not always mean a child is under the conviction of the Holy Spirit but that appropriate curiosity is present.

Answer your child's questions simply and briefly. You might say something like: ***"People are baptized after they accept Jesus as their Savior. When a person accepts Jesus as his Savior, Jesus forgives his sins, and the person trusts Jesus to help him live for God. The person makes a special promise or commitment to live in a way that pleases Jesus."***

As your child asks further questions, you may need to explain that baptism is a way of showing others that a person has trusted Jesus to forgive his sins. If your child wants to know when she can be baptized, you

might tell her: ***"You are growing and learning more and more. We can talk anytime you have questions. One day, God will help you know when it is time for you to accept Jesus as your Savior. One day, you will understand that you are separated from God and need to be forgiven of your sins and you will tell Jesus about it and ask Him to come into your life. After that happens, you can be baptized."***

Because your preschooler wants to feel included in the service, his interest in the Lord's Supper likely will be very strong, also. Explain that the bread and juice help remind the people who eat them that Jesus is their Savior and we remember how Jesus died.

Even though these statements are expressed as simply as possible, preschoolers usually do not fully understand many of the words used, such as accept, Savior, sins, trust, commitment, and forgive. As your child asks questions, explain words such as these, using examples your child can understand. Your patience, reassurance, and interest in her questions will help her to continue to come to you and others in your church for guidance.

Remember, this is a perpetual learning and experiencing time in the life of your child. Continue to answer questions as they arise. There is often no need to push, nor is there any reason to discourage. Children love and believe in Jesus at an early age. Affirm this, but also be aware that belief in Jesus and the recognition in the Holy Spirit's conviction of sin are different. Learning and discovering have their place and the Holy Spirit does as well.

Please feel free to contact Rev. Eickhoff or Dr. Roberts. Our desire is to guide your child to a saving knowledge and acceptance of Jesus Christ as his or her Lord and Savior as the Holy Spirit guides.
