

TBC Women's Ministry will partner with Global Aid Network (GAiN) to address the special needs of women in impoverished countries. Without access to feminine hygiene supplies, women in developing countries are unable to leave their homes, are shunned, and can miss up to 20% of school or work days. LuoPads are washable and reusable sanitary products that can restore dignity and allows GAiN's ministry partners the opportunity to tell these women that Jesus loves and values them. Donations of any size towels, washcloths, and flannel fabric are needed and can be placed in bins located throughout the church. Two shifts are available to help assemble the LuoPads. You do not need to commit to the entire time slot to help. Sewers and portable sewing machines are needed, as well as those who can trace and cut out the simple pattern. 

Passing on Faith Requires Intentionality

Faith-talk requires that we intentionally involve ourselves in the lives of our children. Mark Holmen insists that parents know what is going on in their child's life and experience life with them. He encourages talking about everyday items with them as well as being involved with the big decisions in their life. He suggests that in addition to being intentional about communicating with your children, be intentional about modeling and sharing your faith with them.

What does intentionally showing your child how to live God's way look like? It looks like tiny steps taken every single day. It requires joyfully showing and telling them some of the same things over and over. It is being transparent with them from day one so they not only understand what the goal is, but they will also desire it themselves. It starts with the faith in your own heart. It starts today, whether your children are tiny or taller than you are.

- Let your children see you read God's Word and pray.
- Tell your children how you are growing and learning new things.

However, it is not the best way. The best requires children learning and discovering faith in relationship with the significant adults in their lives. Parents are the key to a faith that sticks with their children. I hope you will accept this challenge.

Mission Projects

In light of the recent hurricane and flooding down east, our children have been asked to help in small ways. Check out these projects and help wherever you feel led.

Decorate white trash bags for the Baptist Men's Laundry Relief: When people bring their laundry to be cleaned by the laundry truck, the volunteers place one families laundry in a trash bag. Our children were asked to write verses or decorate the bags with positive sayings.

Disaster Relief Comfort kits: Take a gallon size zip-loc bag and choose four items from the list below, mark the age on the bag and possible gender then return the sealed kit to your child's mission leader or the tub in the grade school hallway. Comfort kit instructions are provided on the hallway.

Needs list: Choose 4 Items to include in your gallon bag. For all kits: Bibles and small notes are always welcomed.

Baby (0-3 mos., 3-6 mos, 6-9 mos, 9-12 mos, 12-18 mos, 18-24 mos): diaper, baby nail clippers, sippie cup, pacifier, diaper shirt, handi-wipes, small soft washable toy or soft book.

Child (2-3 yrs., 4-5 yrs., 6-7 yrs., 8-9 yrs., 10-12 yrs.): new small stuffed animal, wash cloth, doll, books, puzzles, small games, colors/coloring book, small toy(age appropriate—cars for boys, etc.), comb/brush

How to Help Young Children Express Their Feelings

Young children frequently feel overwhelmed and frightened when they're in the grip of powerful emotions, resulting in behaviors that can leave you as parents unclear on the appropriate course of action. Because young children are not familiar with identifying their feelings and expressing them in a suitable manner, they sometimes act out in ways such as biting, hitting, or throwing temper tantrums. These are proven strategies for aiding children in learning to process and express their emotions in a healthy way.

One thing we can teach preschoolers to do is be able to name their feelings. Children have a natural tendency to want to identify and name everything, so work with that instinct when a child begins to exhibit behavior in response to emotional stimuli. You can use games, posters, videos, and puppets to teach children the names of a range of emotions.

We can also teach our children positive expression techniques. Make sure to keep in mind that some children are more verbally

adept than others, and it may be easier for these children to learn to develop the necessary skills for positive self-expression. Also remember that young children also naturally look to teachers, parents and other adults for guidance, so providing a good role model for your child helps them cultivate positive patterns.
