Words from Lydia

This morning as I drove my children to school, David, my five-year-old son, said from the backseat, “Mommy, I am working on my prayer for after devotion. Can I pray first?” I told him yes, and he sat in the back seat preparing to lead the three of us in prayer once we got into the carpool line. Once I put the car into park in front of his school, I pulled out our Bible like we do everyday and began to read a passage from Luke. David and I talked about the passage together, and then it was his turn. My child, who appreciates brevity, prayed such a beautiful prayer thanking God for Jesus’ birth in Bethlehem and His death on the cross for our sins. Once he finished, I thanked him for praying with us and told him that it was such a wonderful prayer. What he said back to me still has me floored. He said, “That’s my gift – prayer. I felt the Holy Spirit tugging on my heart, and that is why I wanted to pray first before you. I needed to say that to God.”

What is your gift? We all have them. Do you have the gift of hospitality or compassion? Do you love to take care of others? Do

you have the gift of service? Do you like to live out your faith with your nose to the grindstone in the hopes that you will bring glory to God and not to yourself? Maybe you have the gift of prayer and you are the unofficial designated prayer in your Sunday School class. Or, you have the gift of listening, and you are happy to be a listening ear for those around you.

We all have gifts given to us by God, and we all are called to use them for His glory. But, maybe, like me sometimes, you just are not too good at listening to God’s callings and promptings in your life. Have you forgotten how to love God by being a good steward of all of the gifts He has given you? Or, have you noticed “the Holy Spirit tugging” but have not obliged? I encourage you to listen for God’s call and watch for the tug of the Holy Spirit. You will be surprised when you notice that it has been there all this time.

– Jeremiah 33:3

The Bible and prayer are inseparable! Call to Him....He will answer you.... And He will show you.... He will let you see Great and Mighty things.
