This past Sunday, we voted to approve our 2017 budget and I want to thank everyone who is a part of that important process. Our Finance Committee, Treasurers and Trustees do a wonderful job each year in determining the financial needs of the congregation. In addition, your continued stewardship allows our congregation to offer so many opportunities for worship, fellowship, discipleship, missions and ministry. As your pastor, I want to thank you for this important process and support.

This week you should receive the ballots for our Deacon, Trustee and Pastoral Advisory Council. Each and every year, we have the opportunity to participate in choosing from our congregation men and women who will serve faithfully in these leadership roles. This year, we will again elect 20 deacons who will serve a three-year term. You will be asked to elect 3 Trustees and 1 new Pastoral Advisory Council member.

The process for choosing these nominees occurs over a period of time through the work of our Deacons and Nominating Committee. They have done a tremendous job in seeking candidates for these positions, who are faithful to our church and have demonstrated servant leadership. I want to thank everyone who agreed to be on the slate of nominees.

I encourage you to take this time of choosing a candidate seriously. Spend some time praying over the candidates. Pray for their families and for their ministry here in our church. Pray for those you will select and for those you do not select. Pray that God will use us all in the place God has for us to serve.

As it is indicated in the letter, we will be receiving these ballots until Sunday, November 13, 2016. The ballot boxes will be in the ROC lobby on Sunday and can be found in the Church Office during the week. The bulletin boards in the ROC lobby will also have the pictures of all of our nominees. The last time to turn in your ballot will be at the end of the second service on November 13, 2106.

In light of the recent hurricane and flooding down east, our children have been asked to help in small ways. Check out these projects and we welcome your help wherever you feel led.

- Decorate white trash bags for the Baptist Men's Laundry Relief: When people bring their laundry to be cleaned by the laundry truck, the volunteers place one families laundry in a trash bag. Our children were asked to write verses or decorate the bags with positive sayings.
- Disaster Relief Comfort kits: We did this project for VBS this year and decided to do it again. Take a gallon size zip-loc bag and choose four items from the list below, mark the age on the bag and possible gender then return the sealed kit to your child's mission leader or the tub in the grade school hallway. Comfort kit instructions are provided on the hallway.

Age breakdowns are as follows:

Baby: (0-3 months, 3-6 months, 6-9 months, 9-12 months, 12-18 months, 18-24 months)

Child: (2-3 years, 4-5 years, 6-7 years, 8-9 years, 10-12 years)

Needs list: Choose 4 Items to include in your gallon bag.

Baby: Diaper, Baby Nail Clippers, Sippie Cup, Pacifier, Diaper Shirt, Handi-Wipes, Small Soft Washable Toy or Soft Book. **Child:** New Small Stuffed Animal, Wash Cloth, Doll, Books, Puzzles, Small Games, Colors/Coloring Book, Small Toy (Age Appropriate — Cars for Boys, etc.), Comb/Brush

Disaster, Displacement Can Trigger Stress in Kids

Stress doesn't just affect adults. Changes in a child's life can have a big impact. In families dealing with devastating flooding across eastern North Carolina, children may be feeling lots of pressure.

Pajama Program Project

This fall we are partnering with the Pajama Program that is here in Wake County. It provides new pajamas and new books to children in need nationwide, many of whom are waiting to be adopted. These children live in group homes, shelters and temporary housing facilities and are shuffled often from one place to another. We are asking that you bring in a new set of pajamas in your child's size as well as a new book that a child might enjoy reading while getting ready for bed.

I encourage you to take your child with you to help select the book and pair of pajamas. This will be a great opportunity for you to have a conversation with your child about missions and why it is important to help others. We will be collecting the pajamas and books through the end of October.

Here are a few signs for parents to look out for:

Negative changes in behavior: For younger kids, withdrawal from their favorite activities, becoming clingy to a parent or even a sudden change in their appetite are all red flags. Becoming hostile towards family and abandoning friendships are more common signs among teens.

Interaction with others: how your child interacts with others outside of the home can indicate if stress is factor. Experts say a good way for parents to tap into their child's behaviors is communicating with each other, teachers, and coaches.

Listen to your child: Kids may often express how overwhelmed they are with words like "angry" or "annoyed," or they speak negatively about themselves. Parent should keep an ear out for key words or phrases that may indicate a source of stress.

Seek support: Parents should know that tackling the stress in their child's life is not something they have to do alone. Licensed therapists can provide the support and guidance their child needs.
