Deepen The Ties That Bind

This election cycle has caused much angst for many Americans and in particular for those who are followers of Jesus. Many have asked, "What would Jesus do? Or who would Jesus vote for?" These are hard questions to answer, partly because Jesus lived in a political world so different from ours. Jesus did not live in a democracy, and He could not vote. In fact, Jesus does not speak of government reform but of personal transformation. When people tried to trap Jesus in political arguments it was His norm to call them to think beyond the current political issue. Jesus did say, "Render to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God." There are certain obligations we have toward government. We are obliged to vote as part of the process. We are commanded to pray for those who are in leadership. However, we are always to remember that our worship and faith is ultimately in God and not in human endeavors.

The question of voting is also hard to answer because we are not voting for Jesus. We must make choices between men and women who are flawed like you and me. There is no perfect candidate or platform.

So what is a faithful follower of Jesus to do? As a pastor, I will not tell you how to vote. I think everyone must vote his or her own conscience. However, there are a few important matters in response to this election cycle that I believe I can speak to with great confidence.

First, the Kingdom of God and the United States of America are not the same thing. We must always keep the proper perspective on this truth. No matter what happens in the United States politically the Kingdom of God will last, flourish, and be victorious. So, I urge you not to be fearful or anxious. Place your faith in the One who is everlasting to everlasting.

Second, the relationship of brother and sister in Christ is more important to God than which political party you belong to or for whom you will cast your vote. When we spew hatred toward our brothers and sisters in Christ, because they disagree with us politically, we are forgetting the commands of scripture to love one another. Jesus said we would be recognized by the world because we love one another. Voting for a Republican, or a Democrat is not the unforgivable sin. You might be able to unfriend someone on Facebook due to their political view; but because of Jesus, they still are your brother and sister in Christ. Whether we like it or not, (and I like it) the church is filled with Democrats, Republicans, and Independents. We must learn to love each other and grant grace to others. If we want to follow Jesus, we must remember that our most important label is not liberal or conservative but Christian. We must refuse to let the politics of our nation divide the Body of Christ. It is not biblical, and it is not worth it.

Third, let us take our unique witness as the Church seriously. What has caused me the most stress in this election cycle is the witness of the Church. If we are going to have any influence on our culture in the future, our nation must see that followers of Jesus are authentic. We must refuse to be co-opted by any political entity. The Church must remain free from the government and political entanglement so we might maintain our unique role of prophet to the nation and culture. My friends, our witness to this world is far more important than any election cycle.

I urge you to keep your eyes on Jesus. Don't lose an eternal perspective. Love your brother and sister in Christ. Do nothing that would hinder your witness to a lost and dying world.

I close by thinking of that old hymn that reminds me of what is ultimately true:

My Hope is built on nothing less than Jesus' blood and righteousness.

I dare not trust the sweetest frame but wholly lean on Jesus' Name; On Christ the solid rock I stand; All other ground is sinking sand; All other ground is sinking sand.

Medicare Open Enrollment Through December 7 • Trinity

One rule of thumb for those on original Medicare (parts A, B & D) during Medicare Open Enrollment is: Marry your Supplement but just Date your Drug Plan. Huh???

When you choose a supplemental insurance plan, stick with it for the long haul. Initial rates for supplemental policies are the same for everyone, i.e., factors like weight and being a smoker are not considered. However, if you want to change after your initial sign up, more than likely you will go through underwriting where factors like weight and being a smoker are considered and may result in significantly higher premiums. That doesn't mean you can't divorce from your supplemental policy, just be very careful in doing so.

Drug Plans are quite different as they are designed to be re-examined each year. Why? These policies do not go through underwriting, i.e., the rates are the same for everyone, and insurance companies' contracts with pharmacies and drug companies may be renegotiated each year resulting in different end costs for you. Additionally, your prescription drugs may change from year to year. For those reasons, you should use the Drug Plan Calculator at www.medicare.gov to determine which plan will be most economical for you and the specific drugs you take. It even tells you what your drugs will cost at the pharmacies you prefer to use! While the Calculator is user friendly, why not take advantage of a SHIIP Counselor's help, especially the first time you use it?

Seniors' Health Insurance Information Program (SHIIP), housed in the NC Department of

Insurance, is a free program established in 1986 to help educate Medicare beneficiaries about Medicare, Medicare supplements, long-term care insurance, Medicare Advantage, Medicare Part D prescription drug plans and other health insurance options for people with Medicare. Volunteer Counselors meet face-to-face with people. Kathy Driver, a SHIIP Volunteer and TBC member, will be in the TBC office to assist TBC members and Capitol Towers residents.
