Words from Katie

Last Wednesday night our church participated in an Ash Wednesday service. Part of that service included one of the ministers placing ashes on our foreheads saying, "from ashes you came and to ashes you shall return." When I returned to the preschool hall many of the preschoolers were asking, "Miss Katie what is on your forehead?" Lent can be difficult to explain to our children because often we misunderstand it ourselves. Lent is a season of contrasts. We prepare during Lent to celebrate the memorial of Christ's passion, death, and resurrection. Lent is a season that is about a journey from life to death, both spiritually and in the physical world. With that said, it's a difficult concept to talk with our children about. There are some ways that we talk to our children about the season including:

Season's Length

Lent is an important holy season that leads up to the most important day of the church year --- Easter. The period begins on Ash Wednesday and then there are 40 days (minus Sundays) until Easter.

Giving Up

Typically, people of the Christian faith give something up for the time period of Lent. This is meant as a way to re-prioritize and focus on God again. It is recommended to

give up something loved and used in daily life --- Think of ways your family could do this practice together during this season.

Fasting

Another important aspect of Lent is fasting. Catholics practice fasting on Fridays during the Lenten season, and in addition, do not eat meat on Fridays. Fridays are meant to be a day of reflection and prayer, and allow people to cleanse their bodies in preparation for Easter. What are some things that perhaps your family could 'fast' from this Lenten season?

Holy Week

The most important week during the entire season of Lent is Holy Week, as it celebrates Jesus' last week on Earth. Holy Week begins one week before Easter on Palm Sunday. Then, on Maundy Thursday, Christians celebrate the anniversary of the Last Supper, where the first Holy Communion was performed. Good Friday is the day Jesus was crucified and died. It is on Easter Sunday that the Lenten season ends, as it was discovered that Jesus rose from the dead.

I hope this is helpful as we all work together to teach our children about our faith. There are Lenten devotions for families located on the preschool hall. Take one and journey together this season!
