## Deepen The Ties That Bind

As your Pastor, it is my responsibility to keep you informed regarding the actions of our various mission partners. As you know, we are considered a dually aligned congregation. We support both the Southern Baptist Convention and the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship with our mission giving and work. We often work with churches that are exclusively one or the other. Congregations like ours are becoming rare. However, from my perspective we are practicing a great Baptist conviction of the autonomy of the local church and the cooperative spirit of missions.

In this spirit, I think it is always important to share with you any actions that were taken by the national organizations of the SBC or CBF. This past week the SBC met in Phoenix, Arizona. According to the official SBC website the number of messengers registered for the meeting was 5,018. This was down from over 7,000 last year. The major emphasis of the meeting was on evangelism and the declining membership in SBC congregations. Of the 8 motions presented to the convention, the only motion to pass was one to establish an Evangelism Task Team. Other motions were either ruled out of order or sent to committee.

The convention also considered 10 resolutions. Resolutions at the SBC are not binding statements and carry no authority over the local church or the individual Baptist. They are merely a reflection of the views of those messengers who have gathered for the convention. As the SBC website explains:

*A resolution has traditionally been defined as an expression of opinion or concern, as compared to a motion, which calls for action. A resolution is not used to direct an entity of the Southern Baptist Convention to specific action other than to communicate the opinion or concern expressed. Resolutions are passed during the annual Convention meeting.*

There were many resolutions offered at the convention. There was one against gambling; another calling for the defunding of Planned Parenthood and one that expressed the "importance of moral leadership." The resolution that was covered by the national media and drew the most attention was Resolution 17. This motion concerned the "Anti-Gospel of Anti-Right White Supremacy."

African American pastor, Rev. William McKissic, of Texas, offered the original resolution. The original motion faced several obstacles but after discussion and revision was presented for a vote. The presented resolution passed by what was described as a 99 percent vote and a standing ovation.

## Dr. Roberts... *continued*

Why is this an important step for Southern Baptists? It is important because of the history of the SBC. The Southern Baptist Convention was born out of the Civil War struggle and the issue around slavery. Over its history the SBC has continued to seek to distance itself from its beginnings through statements of reconciliation and also repentance of its past. This resolution is also critical for the future of the SBC. Currently as the resolution states:

*More than 20 percent (nearly eleven thousand) of our cooperating Southern Baptist congregations identify as predominately non-Anglo and for the last three years more than 50 percent of Southern Baptist new church plants have been predominantly non-Anglo.*

The heart of the resolution states:

*WHEREAS, Racism and white supremacy are, sadly, not extinct but present all over the world in various white supremacist movements, sometimes known as "white nationalism" or "alt-right"; now, therefore, be it*

*RESOLVED, That the messengers to the Southern Baptist Convention, meeting in Phoenix, Arizona, June 13-14, 2017, decry every form of racism, including alt-right white supremacy, as antithetical to the Gospel of Jesus Christ; and be it further*

*RESOLVED, That we denounce and repudiate white supremacy and every form of racial and ethnic hatred as a scheme of the devil intended to bring suffering and division to our society; and be it further*

*RESOLVED, That we acknowledge that we still must make progress in rooting out any remaining forms of intentional or unintentional racism in our midst; and be it further*

*RESOLVED, That we earnestly pray, both for those who advocate racist ideologies and those who are thereby deceived, that they may see their error through the light of the Gospel,*

*repent of these hatreds, and come to know the peace and love of Christ through redeemed fellowship in the Kingdom of God, which is established from every nation, tribe, people, and language.*

TBC has been involved in JfL since 2007. Our faithful Lead Team has completed 17 classes with 110 graduates! We've seen around 80 different volunteers involved in this mission.

Jobs for Life is a Raleigh-based international organization that pursues its mission and vision by mobilizing churches to reach out to the unemployed/underemployed and equip them to better succeed in the workplace. Each JfL church provides biblical instruction, job training, coaching, and personal support to their city's neediest citizens, helping lift them from dependency to self-sufficiency as a part of God's purpose for meaningful work.

The local church volunteers are equipped with the training & resources, including a

biblically-based 16 session curriculum and local employers who participate in round table discussions and mock interviews. Each student is provided at least one volunteer Champion who serves as mentor and cheerleader for the duration of the class and beyond.

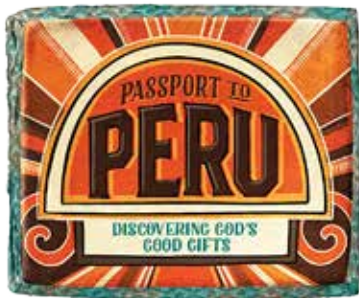
