The team has been in conversation with many in our congregation, as well as utilizing a survey the Deacons performed a year ago concerning our fellowship suppers. This coming Sunday night, July 16, this team will make their recommendations to the church in Church Conference. I am so grateful for the work of this team, and I am looking forward to hearing all of their recommendations and ideas. We meet for July Church Conference at 7:00 p.m. in the Chapel.

So, as you can tell, the church is very active even in a time when many believe that the church is not as active. It reminds me that our lives can be similar. There are times when change is slow, God’s presence is hard to see, and it seems life has come to a standstill. I am reminded through the yearly seasons of church life that God is always working. Sometimes in ways that are evident and sometimes in ways we are yet to understand. I want to encourage you that when you don’t see the evidence of God’s work, you might just be on the brink of something wonderful for which God has been preparing you.

I am looking forward to seeing you Sunday as we continue our series “The Roman Road to Transformation.”

I would like to thank the Disaster Relief Team that deployed to help re-build Patricia Troy's house in Clinton, NC. This was one of the most successful deployments of the Trinity Building Team that I have been a part of. The team members were Mark Munday, Harold Johnson, Dickie Wyatt, Tom Gatten, Mike Ferree, Adam Mills and Barry Smith.

We installed kitchen flooring and cabinets, installed and trimmed exterior windows, installed and trimmed interior doors and hardware, cased door openings, trimmed exterior doors, installed front porch roof trim, wired a closet outlet, installed baseboard and caulked nail holes and interior trim.

We prayed and gave thanks for the opportunity to serve by helping with the re-building after Hurricane Matthew. Billy Layton (the Disaster Relief Site Commander) expressed his thanks and explained that with the progress that we made on Patricia's house, the two teams that would follow us should be able to complete three houses by June 30.

The Southern Baptist Disaster Relief Organization has made a commitment of three years to help re-build after Hurricane Matthew. The Trinity Baptist Disaster Relief Team plans to send teams on the third week of the next five months, Wednesday through Saturday. 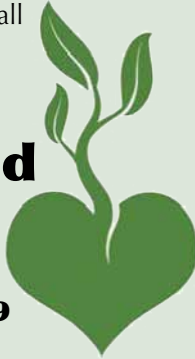
