PARENT TOPIC: Discerning the Signs

Most parents recognize that timing is important in rearing children. Educator Robert Havighurst has referred to the most opportune time for teaching and learning as the “teachable moment.” Havighurst believes that there is a period when a child is socially and mentally ready to learn. Certain social and mental conditions have to be right before a child is at a peak time for learning a certain concept or skill.

Timing is certainly important in rearing children. This is true in all phases of their growing and learning. Knowing when your child is ready to respond to Christ as Savior is the first step in assuring helpful guidance on your part.

So when is a child ready? This varies from child to child and is true even in a family where children have been reared under similar conditions. Children are different and grow and develop at different rates. Age is not always a criteria. Some parents are reluctant to push their child to make a decision that may or may not be meaningful to them. Nor do parents want children to delay making their decision for Christ once they are ready.

But how is that best determined?

One of the mysteries of life is the way the Spirit of God works in people's lives to bring them to faith in Christ. Prior to Christian conversion, the Holy Spirit's work is that of creating a sense of need in the unbeliever by revealing two things. First, a person is led to see himself as a sinner, helpless, and in need. Second, she is led to see that Christ is the Savior of sinners and is everything the sinner is not. By creating this tension or guilt over the sinner's relationship to God, the Holy Spirit purposes to bring the person to a place of repentance and faith.

What might this look like –especially for a child? **Join us on Sunday evening, February 11 at 6:00 pm for a discussion about Faith in the Family.**
