This past week I attended a funeral for a parent of one of our church members. It was early in the week and in one of our eastern North Carolina towns. On this evening as I was heading east, most others were heading west evacuating the coastal areas due to Hurricane Florence. When we gathered for the funeral service, I could not help but think of the storms this community of faith was facing both literally and figuratively. This family had recently suffered another loss of a younger member of their family. I had attended that funeral as well. The uncertainty of life, and the seeming certainty of disease and death, was evident as we gathered again to support this family. They were in a storm of grief. As a backdrop to this funeral service was the uncertainty of what the next week would bring to this town and to us all in North Carolina. While most people were evacuating or at home stocking up and getting ready for a hurricane, this community of faith filled a sanctuary to support this family in a time of grief.

As the service started, I could tell this was going to be a time of worship for those who gathered. As we remembered the one who had passed and shared laughter and tears at his passing, we also heard those familiar passages of comfort, and we stood to sing of God's love and grace. The service began with "A Mighty Fortress is our God." In the middle of the service a soloist sang "Amazing Grace" and reminded us all "the Lord has promised good to me." The service concluded with us standing and singing "Joyful, Joyful We Adore Thee." As we made our way to the fellowship hall to greet the family, the organist played a postlude and I sang along quietly "God our help in ages past our hope for years to come."

Driving home that night I thought about what I had experienced. What type of people gathers in support of others while everyone else is focused on self and survival? What type of people, in the storm of grief and the literal danger of "storms", stand and sing "a mighty fortress is our God, the Lord has promised good to me, joyful we adore thee, and God our help in ages past our hope for years to come?" We call such people "The Church."

As we recover and help others recover from Hurricane Florence, we will do so with faith in a God who is faithful in every storm and has promised good to us.

FINAL MISSION TO SANTA ELENA, BELIZE!



So many TBC members have partnered with God and the congregation of Santa Elena Baptist Church to construct the Santa Elena Baptist Primary School. The school is wide-open with over 130 students and just had its first Graduation in June (13 students!). Pastor Manny has asked for assistance in building the walls of the two classrooms on the second floor of the preschool building. He already has funds for building materials. He needs willing hearts and hands. These two rooms will be tiled and air conditioned for use as school principal's office and computer lab.

It will take two weeks to accomplish this mission. Some will be able to stay for two weeks – others will choose only one. The dates are January 3-19. We will stay at the Aguada Hotel within walking distance of the school. We will have free days built in on Caye Caulker as usual.

Cost for one week (air fare, ground transportation, lodging, most meals, ice/water, water taxi, insurance and t-shirt) will be around \$1,475. Cost for two weeks will be around \$2,200 (yet to be calculated). Sign Up Sheets are on the Sign-Up Board in the Narthex

After a Natural Disaster

The Butterfly Hug is a calming technique created by therapist Luciana Artigas after Hurricane Pauline struck Mexico in 1997. It's a simple technique that can help children (and adults) relax and find peace. Ms. Artigas developed this technique after one of the children she was counseling asked, "Who will embrace me after you are gone?" Determined to come up with a way for children to feel accompanied in their trauma, Ms. Artigas and her husband developed the butterfly hug. The butterfly hug is a great reminder to children that there is nowhere we can go God is not with us. With practice, children can learn to practice the butterfly hug without the aid of a parent or guide.

Guide your children through these steps:

1. Share some verses from Psalm about God's protection. (Psalm 139:9-12)
2. Sit or lie in a relaxed position.
3. Take a couple of deep breaths to begin to calm down and relax.
4. Cross your arms across your chest so that your fingertips rest just under your collar bone. Fingers should point more toward the top of the head, rather than the side of the body. Thumbs can interlock, or not, depending on what is most comfortable.
5. Gently close eyes, or softly focus ahead.
6. Alternate tapping fingers, left and right, at whatever speed feels most comfortable.
7. Continue to breathe deeply while tapping, left and right. Keep tapping for at least 3 minutes.
8. Either end the butterfly hug naturally (when the child feels calm and ready) or by saying, *"Thank you God, for peace. Help us to feel peace whenever we feel worried or unsafe."*

Notes: * This practice can be a ceremony for after a natural disaster or it can be used as a spiritual practice for children who struggle with rest and worry. Remember it takes patience and practice.

*This may also work well at bedtime. Practice the butterfly hug for a few minutes and then say a blessing for children.

*Singing a soft song during the practice often works as well.

Faith & Family FESTIVAL AT HOME...

OUR FAITH AND FAMILY AT HOME FESTIVAL WAS A GREAT TIME OF LEARNING AND FELLOWSHIP. I WANTED TO TAKE SOME TIME TO DEDICATE A SECTION OF MY NEWSLETTER EACH WEEK TO SOME FAITH AND FAMILY THINGS YOU CAN DO AT YOUR HOME WITH YOUR FAMILY. THIS WEEK: **LECTIO DIVINA**.

WHAT IS LECTIO DIVINA: THIS IS A FORM OF PRAYER USING THE SCRIPTURES. LECTIO DIVINA IS A SLOW, RHYTHMIC READING AND PRAYING OF A SCRIPTURE PASSAGE. YOU PICK A PASSAGE AND READ IT SEVERAL TIMES NOTICING HOW GOD SPEAKS TO YOU WHILE READING IT.

A FEW WAYS TO USE THIS WITH CHILDREN

1. USING AN ILLUSTRATED BIBLE FOR CHILDREN,
1. SELECT A STORY. GATHER YOUR FAMILY AND INVITE THEM TO SIT QUIETLY FOR A FEW MINUTES. ALLOW THE CHILDREN TO HOLD THE BIBLE AND LOOK AT THE ILLUSTRATION WHILE YOU READ THE STORY. READ THE STORY SLOWLY, THEN PAUSE FOR A MINUTE. INVITE THE CHILDREN TO LISTEN FOR WHAT GOD IS DOING. THEN READ THE STORY A SECOND TIME. ASK THE CHILDREN TO TELL YOU WHAT IS HAPPENING IN THE STORY.. PERHAPS ASK THEM WHICH CHARACTER THEY WOULD LIKE TO BE IN THE STORY. AFTER A FEW MINUTES OF SHARING, ASK THE CHILDREN WHAT THEY WOULD LIKE TO SAY TO GOD AFTER HEARING THE STORY. FINALLY, INVITE THE CHILDREN INTO A FEW MINUTES OF QUIET, TELLING THEM THAT GOD WANTS TO TELL THEM SOMETHING IN RESPONSE TO WHAT THEY TOLD HIM.
2. PRAYER. INVITE YOUR CHILD TO RESPOND TO THE STORY IN PRAYER: "YOU KNOW, GOD GIVES US STORIES LIKE THIS TO HELP US GROW CLOSER TO HIM.

LET'S PRAY TO GOD ABOUT THIS STORY. WHAT WOULD YOU LIKE TO SAY TO GOD? OR WHAT QUESTIONS DO YOU WANT TO ASK GOD ABOUT THIS STORY?"

3. PROVIDE GUIDING PROMPTS, IF NECESSARY.
BE SURE TO OFFER YOUR OWN PRAYER RESPONSE, BOTH TO MAKE THE EXPERIENCE PRAYERFUL FOR YOU AND TO MODEL PRAYER FOR YOUR CHILD.
4. LISTENING. WITH YOUNG CHILDREN, CONTEMPLATION AND MEDITATION CAN BE DESCRIBED AS LISTENING TO GOD: "NOW THAT WE'VE PRAYED TO GOD ABOUT THIS STORY, LET'S BE QUIET SO WE CAN HEAR WHAT GOD MIGHT BE SAYING BACK TO US, INSIDE OUR HEARTS." TAKE AT LEAST THIRTY SECONDS TO BE SILENT. IF YOUR CHILD IS RESTLESS OR NOISY, DO YOUR BEST TO COMPLETE THE PERIOD OF SILENCE YOURSELF. REMEMBERING CHILDREN LEARN BY BEING MODELED TOO.

THIS BEAUTIFUL PRACTICE CAN BE A POWERFUL EXPERIENCE OF PRAYING WITH SCRIPTURE AS A FAMILY. AS THE CHILDREN BEGIN TO READ, THEY CAN TAKE TURNS READING THE SCRIPTURE STORY. AS THE PRACTICE BECOMES PART OF THE DAILY FAMILY ROUTINE, THE TIME CAN BE EXTENDED TO INCLUDE MORE DISCUSSION AND PRAYER.
