This coming Sunday, October 28, we will be voting on our proposed budget for 2019. I am thankful to our Finance Committee and all of the Committees and Ministries of our congregation who participate in the budgeting process. There is a tendency for us to view the budgeting process as something that is "necessary" but not spiritual. However, I would suggest to you that our budget is a way that we express our priorities as a congregation. In our budget you will find allocations for "missions" but I believe every part of the budget is about mission.

In our 2019 budget there will be gifts to our mission partners that will allow missionaries who have been called by God to stay on the mission field and share the good news of Jesus. Our budget will also include funds to ensure that our own church members will be able to go and work and experience being on mission in our city and around the world. The budget also has what many might call "fixed costs" or "overhead." Items such as utilities, maintenance and facility improvements might fit into such categories. Yet, when I walk around our campus I do not see "overhead." When I walk the halls of our church building, I think about the Sunday School class that meets in that room and the deep relationships which are being built. I think about a space where our students meet and are taught about Jesus but also a safe place where they can ask hard questions about faith. On certain hallways, I can hear the laughter of children busy learning Bible verses or acting out a Biblical story. On another hall, I can hear musicians practicing their gifts so they can lead us weekly in a time of worship. In the ROC I meet neighbors who have found community by walking with others on the track or children from our Weekday Preschool playing in the gym. As I walk through the office I look into the faces of dedicated employees of the church who work diligently behind the scenes to make sure that our ministers have what they need to minister to our congregation.

When I sit in a minister's staff meeting I do not see "personnel" but I see men and women called by God to minister to people. I know that they will be here hours before and after others in the church come and go. I know they will be the ones who will leave their own family's gathering to go and minister to a family in crisis. I know they will be the ones who are holding someone's hand and having a prayer before surgery. They will be the ones laughing and rejoicing with others as they celebrate good news. They will give a listening ear to someone who is struggling with a decision. In each of these moments they will be Jesus to others and they will represent our congregation's love and care in those moments.

So, when I look at our budget I do not simply see numbers and bottom lines. I also know there is no such thing as "overhead" or "fixed costs" when it comes to our church. Every part of our budget is essential for us to carry out our calling as Trinity Baptist Church.

Robin and I joyfully give our tithe and gifts to our congregation. Our church is not simply one of the charities to which we give. We do not view the church as a charity or another non-profit. Our church is our spiritual family and what we do together is the only thing on this earth that Because our church is family we give not out of compulsion but out of deep is eternal. love for Christ and for you.

> If you are not giving to our congregation, then I want to encourage you to consider how you can become obedient and faithful in giving. If you are giving to our work together, then I want to thank you and encourage you to give with great joy. God is doing great things among us and has great things in store for us. As your

WHEN CAN A CHILD BELIEVE?

Have you ever wondered at what age or what point in time a person becomes accountable to the Holy Spirit and God? When do we begin to realize our true spiritual condition that determines whether we are saved or lost? The New Testament writers did not specifically list practices and ideas of the 1st century church in relationship to children.

And we must understand that the Bible does not offer one way of salvation for children and another way for adults. The basics in the conversion experience are the same regardless of the age of a person. Accountability relates to one's ability to deal with the basic truth of the gospel. Until a child, youth or adult reaches this point, he/she is scarcely to be judged accountable.

Dr. William Hendricks in the book, Children and Conversion, summarizes several basic facts in terms of having faith in God who brought the facts to be. 1. Jesus came from God, the God of Israel who made heaven and earth. 2. People killed Christ. Therefore we all bear responsibility in Christ's death. 3. Yet, Christ's death was according to God's plan. 4. Christ is raised from the dead. 5. God through Christ has sent the Holy Spirit to bear witness to what God in Christ has done for us.

When Dr. Hendricks speaks of faith in God, he is talking about something a lot deeper than a childish affirmation that "I love God" or "God is good." He suggests that the faith which brings salvation "is accompanied by a despair of oneself and all other created things. The despair is evidenced by repentance. Repentance involves sorrow for sin. It is the sorrow for rejecting God."

We do not expect children, youth, or adults to express these feelings in adult theological terms in order to be saved. But we must not dismiss that some understanding of these truths need to be real in the life of a person as conversion takes place.
