

NOVEMBER 6 - Loving and Welcoming our Neighbor Immigrant, Refugees, and Neighbors

The story of Scripture is the story of displaced people. We may need to be biblically motivated, sociologically informed, and practically invited to love and welcome the stranger. Showing hospitality is not only for the benefit of the "stranger" but for the mutuality and strengthening of the church.

Have you ever considered that Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, Moses, Ruth, David, Mary, Joseph, and Jesus were all economic and political refugees and asylum seekers? Many times we view immigrants in Scripture as disembodied characters who represent spiritual realities rather than real foreigners and aliens with whom God had been traveling with all along. We need to read scripture not only as the way to get to know God's character but to also see God's particular acts of mercy, compassion, and justice.

The Bible reveals that God acted on behalf of displaced people. God centers the foreigner and alien not only in God's words (Deut. 10) but also in the story of scripture itself. In the Old Testament, we find this through the acts of God and words of the prophets. In the New Testament, we see this in the life and words of Jesus, who expresses that love-ofneighbor is a sign of our realized love for God.

God's people are knocking on our doors, asking us to let them help us be the church God always intended us to be. It may be that if we really want to know God, we must pay attention to immigrants –not only for their conversion, but for ours.






