A Message from the Treasurer

During this time when the church body is not meeting in person please do not forget there are several convenient ways to give to TBC! Please consider these options are available to help fund the ongoing and vital missions of our church. In lieu of putting money in the collection plate these next few weeks we can each:

- 1) Utilize Online Bill Pay. This is an easy, secure, and almost always a free way to give! Just go to your bank's website, look for the online bill pay option, sign up, and set up a payment for the church. It can be set up for either a one time payment or recurring on a schedule you choose. You are in complete control; the amount can easily be changed by you as needed and it can be stopped by you at any time. The bank will take care of the rest! Feel free to call your bank for additional detail as to how to utilize this very convenient and (almost always) free service!
- 2) Set Up Automatic Draft. Trinity offers the safe and secure option of doing bank draft. Tithes and offerings can be drafted monthly either mid-month or at the very end of the month. If it is preferred to split the contribution it can be divided between the two days the draft is offered. Just contact Jan Brown, Financial Administrator, in the church office and she can get that set up for you.
- 3) **Check By Mail**. Don't forget the good old US Post Office will be happy to deliver our contributions to the church for people who prefer that method.
- 4) Online Giving. Donations can also be made by credit/debit card through the church's website. This is a newer option that has only been available for a few months. While it is very convenient, please note the church does get charged a fee (a percentage of the contribution) when payment is made in this manner. The giver has the option of paying an estimated additional amount to help defray the fee the church is charged. Because of the fees involved we ask members to please consider the other options first but this one is available. To give in this manner just go to our website and click "Give" in the upper right hand corner of the website.

Our church family has perservered though many difficult economic times over our history because of the steadfast commitment of our members to the financial needs of our church. Together we can continue working to bring others to Christ through the missions of TBC!

ISOLATED BUT NOT ALONE

Gather Your Sunday School Class Online Using Zoom By Dean Hering | Sunday School Director

During the weeks when Trinity is closed due to the Coronavirus, you may wish to virtually gather for a Sunday School lesson or just to gather and gab. Zoom is a good way to do this. Zoom is an online video conferencing tool that works on computers, phones, and tablets. If you are teaching a lesson, you can share your desktop if you want to show videos, use PowerPoint or other aids.

Only one person, called the Host, needs an account. You might have a teacher be the host or have your most tech savvy person handle administering your gatherings. The host invites participants using a link to the meeting. For participants it is fairly easy--download the app once and after that you just click on a link

A Participant is an invitee in a meeting scheduled by a Host. A Participant does not require a Zoom account in order to join a meeting. Participants can join a meeting from their phone, desktop, mobile and tablet devices. The first time they join a meeting, Zoom will prompt them to download the free app on their device. Once the app is downloaded, subsequent meetings will use it.

Zoom has different plans—the free one allows 100 participants in a meeting for 40 minutes, so if you can keep your gathering to that, it's free. We like free. Christ's love is free and eternal.

Zoom has a bunch of helpful tutorials and videos to get you started. We recommend doing the following:

- Go to the Getting Started page, https://support.zoom.us/hc/en-us/categories/ 200101697. If you are using a Windows or Mac computer to host, click on Getting Started on Windows and Mac. This will allow you to sign up for an account and set it up.
- Check out the Zoom Video Tutorials at https://support.zoom.us/hc/en-us/articles/ 206618765-Zoom-Video-Tutorials. We suggest watching the Scheduling a Meeting with Zoom Website tutorial to learn how to schedule a meeting and invite others.
- Set up a meeting and test it with some classmates so you can help others after you get the hang of it—the Zoom app is a little different on different phones, tablets, and desktops. Unmuting/muting is probably the thing most people will need the most.

Some Suggestions

- We suggest one host account for your class. Each teacher could have a separate account; however, Zoom allows for recurring meetings and the link to the recurring meeting is good for a year. This means you could invite people with one link that it good for your all your regular classes—you don't have to send out a separate link each week.
- Use the recurring meeting if you plan to do a lesson each week (see bullet one)
- Keep it simple and don't require a meeting password
- Under Video, turn on host and participant so you can see each other by default when the meeting starts.
- Under Audio, choose Computer Audio. This will simplify the meeting invitation and the way participants connect.
- Under Meeting Options, mute participants upon entry. This will keep the background noise (phones, dogs, popcorn makers, kids) of anyone connected muted. Participants can unmute when they want to speak. We suggest suggesting to all participants that they mute themselves when they are done speaking so the audio stays clean for everyone.
- When you invite participants, click the Copy the invitation link and then click Copy Meeting Invitation. That will copy the meeting invitation to the clipboard and you can then paste it into the email to invite your classmates.

Stay safe and stay connected to your class!
