Dear Church Family,

As you know, the response to the COVID -19 virus is ever changing. We are all doing our best to change our habits in regards to work, family, social life and church. The Governor's recent "stay at home" order means that we cannot gather as a congregation at this time. It is our hope and prayer that soon we will begin to have a clearer picture of when and how we can begin to meet in person.

During these past few weeks, our church has been responding to the various changes and state orders to the best of our ability. We continue to do all we can to protect our neighbors and to continue to minister to each other and our community. One of the ways we have tried to respond is to keep you informed of changes and opportunities. On our home page of tbcraleigh.com you will find a whole section on our COVID-19 response. There you will find updates, devotions, mission information and how to give to our church during this time.

Our Trustees, Deacons and Church Council are all meeting this month and staying updated to our day-to-day ministry and having conversations about the opportunities for ministry in the months ahead. We are learning to be nimble and creative in the face of these changes.

I asked the ministers to review our Core Values at Trinity. In doing so, we began to outline ways we can continue to support all of our Core Values by actions. Here are just a few ways we are continuing to act according to our Core Values.

WORSHIP - Our ministers, media team and other members who offer expertise have been meeting and making plans on how to continue to offer worship experiences every Sunday morning. We are excited about this work and the creativity that surrounds our approach. In the next few weeks, expect to hear sermons and hear anthems, soloists and other music offerings that will take various forms. In addition, our Student Ministry and Children's Ministry are offering special worship services and resources for worshipping at home on the website at our COVID-19 Response section.

MISSIONS-We are continuing to explore ways we can be active in mission response. We are asking people to drop food off at the ROC door for North Raleigh Ministries. Another idea is to put a collection box at your own home and ask neighbors to contribute. You can then transport it to the church. We have made arrangements through our volunteers to get this food to NRM. In addition, many Sunday School classes are supporting various other ministry partners like Raleigh Rescue Mission and Welcome House. We are working with Wake County Schools on setting up the opportunity for families to partner with other families who might need technology which they currently do not possess. DISCIPLESHIP-We have educated our Sunday School classes on how they can best utilize technology to continue to meet and have Bible Study. We are providing resources on the website for literature. We are currently working on how to get new literature to teachers and students through the website. Our Student and Children's ministries are providing various resources for discipleship on their tabs in the COVID-19 Response section of the website. Our ministers are also posting devotions throughout the week for encouragement.

MINISTRY- Our deacons, care group leaders and ministers are keeping in touch with families. We are calling, emailing and texting our congregation to pray with them and encourage them. Many are isolated and lonely. This is something that all of us can do. It just takes a few moments to reach out and make a few calls or send a few emails.

FELLOWSHIP- This of course is the hardest value to act upon during this self-isolation period. However, technology can be our friend. Robin and I are learning to have virtual dinner dates with other families. It is not a massive potluck, but it is an attempt to let others know we love them and miss them. You might want to try a Zoom dinner or Sunday lunch after worship. Others are locating members in their neighborhoods and taking a walk together (six feet apart). Be creative in this time while still being safe.

As you see, we are still functioning and ministering as we stay true to our church's Core Values. Remember you are the church and so you too must participate in all these ways if we are going to stay focused on our church's mission.

I am so proud of you and grateful to you during this difficult time. Thank you for all your encouragement and kindness. Thank you for staying faithful in giving, so we can continue to be faithful in ministry. Remember that all correspondence needs to go to:

I speculate in April 2020, there are about **98% multi-site churches** all due to the forced isolation and self-distancing of the COVID pandemic.

We would consider ourselves multi-site because we are one congregation that is broadcasting our services via the Internet to multiple locations—into your homes. We have been forced into a new frontier ---cyberspace with an Internet Campus. And we are blessed to do so for those who are able and willing.

I have been invited to join a virtual focus group composed of Baptist ministers throughout the country sponsored by Pinnacle Leadership out of Central Seminary in MO. In our Emerging Church Practice webinar on Christian Formation this Tuesday we discussed various ways churches are dealing with being church online in order to keep up contact and fellowship with one another. Mark Tidsworth of the "Shift: Three big moves for the 21st Century church" book fame shared --along with Ircel Harrison, Pinnacle Leadership, that we are now serving in multi-site churches. Our group will be discussing in days ahead what this new venture looks like and how to best navigate.

I appreciate your patience and understanding as we attempt to have church and connect with you via Internet and phone. What we make of this new "Multi-site" experience will hopefully lay a foundation for the future at Trinity and within our community. Thank you for participating in our 2nd church campus.

As I plan Easter worship and the weeks to follow, I'm amazed at how much anticipation I used to have that would build until we were able to praise God together in the Sanctuary. The energy and spirit within our worship walls is amazing, and I look forward to the day when we can once again sing from our hearts as one body in church.

Our online worship services have been tremendously effective in keeping us "together" in one mind and one body, but it will be a glorious experience when we all get to a little piece of heaven in the Sanctuary of our Lord! Until we meet again, stay healthy and continue to worship online with us and to remember one another in prayer. We shall overcome!






