Dear Trinity Family,

As we pass through this unprecedented time with the COVID-19 pandemic restrictions, we are now to the point where we can plan in-person worship. We are using for our mission statement:.

"Because we love our family of faith we will seek to minimize risk and trust our congregation to act responsibly."

We will seek to minimize risk

A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another: just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another. By this all people will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another.—John 13:34-35

- **1.** We will offer 2 worship services to allow proper social distancing.
- **2.** Worship Place and Times:
- 8:45 AM Sanctuary
- 10:55 AM Sanctuary
- 10:55 AM Fellowship Hall streaming service for overflow.
- We know everyone has a preference to attend early or late service. Also, we recognize concerns by SS classes to continue to hold their respective SS virtual meetings on Sunday morning. We need your help. We are asking each Sunday School class to have a conversation in preparation for June 28. We are encouraging each class to make adjustments that would allow those in their class to attend worship service on the campus if they are so inclined.
- **3.** Entrances for Sanctuary:
 - Main entrance to Narthex
 - Elevators will not be used (Please park in back if you do not need an elevator)
 - North Six Forks Rd. (Office Portico)
 - Intended for those not able to use stairs. (Please park in front lots if you would normally have used an elevator)
 - South Six Forks Rd. (Bldg. A/B Portico)
 - Intended for those not able to use stairs. (Please park in front lot if you would have normally used an elevator)
 - **4.** Greeters will be at entrances and ask for your confirmation of
 - the self-health check.
 - · understanding of hygiene & sanitation guidelines
 - request to wear a mask. We ask everyone to (except for those age 2 and under) wear a mask covering your
 nose and mouth at all times. (For those without effective masks, supplies are planned at Trinity.)
 - Social distancing will be practiced at the entrance. If you find yourself waiting in line, please distance using the markings on the sidewalk. If you can, we suggest arriving to church a few minutes earlier than usual to accommodate the entry and seating protocol.
 - **5.** Ushers will direct you to seating to facilitate social distancing as people arrive. We plan to use 5 sanctuary entrances.
 - 6. We will sit in every other pew and we will sit in a different set of pews in each service.
 - **7.** Ushers will assist with an orderly exiting from the sanctuary to facilitate social distancing. We will ask participants to exit directly through the sanctuary and facility doors through which they entered.

- 8. Restrooms will be limited.
- 9. Restrooms and Common Areas will be cleaned between services.

We will ask our congregation to act responsibly

Do nothing out of selfish ambition. Rather, in humility value others above yourselves, 4 not looking to your own interests but each of you to the interests of the others.—Philippians 2:3-4

The act of returning to campus requires a great deal of trust in one another. This is why we need everyone to do all they can to not only protect themselves at this time but to protect one another. With this in mind we ask the congregation to follow these recommendations:

- Please self screen your health. If there is any doubt regarding your health in regards to exposing someone else to the Corona Virus or you are in a high-risk category or have a compromised health condition, we ask you remain home at this time and join us through virtual worship.
- We request that as you enter the building you wear a face covering. If you do not have an appropriate face covering, we can provide you with one. Remember, that the face covering is for the good of the other. By cooperating with this request, we are putting one another first. Out of love and care for one another, we ask you cooperate with this request.
- 3. We will ask everyone to social distance while in the building and on campus.

What to expect in worship

- The worship service will be abbreviated and without live vocal music.
- 2. Offering plates, hymnals and pew Bibles have been removed from the Sanctuary. (Please bring your own Bible)
- 3. Bulletins will be online.
- The offering will be received as you exit. You are also encouraged to continue giving through online methods as well as bank drafts and through mail to our Post Office Box.
- 5. Remember, that although worship will look and feel different, God is the same yesterday, today and tomorrow and deserves our praise.



Ebooks and Audiobooks for TBC

Dooks

COVID-19 has changed our world. In our state of quarantine, access to good reading material is very limited. Never fear, eBooks are here.

Trinity now has an eBooks option in the media library. In order to have access to the eBooks, you must request to be on the approved list. Even those who already have a TBC Library Card must request eBook access because I do not have your PIN. The computer

keeps that a secret after I have input it. Those who do not have a TBC Library Card will be issued one. Those who do, will use your card number and PIN to access eBooks after I enter you onto the approved list so that OverDrive will recognize you.

You can apply for a card online by visiting the TBC website at www.tbcraleigh.com and clicking on the TBC Library Online Catalog link on the left side of the website or go directly to tbcrnc. booksys.net/opac/tbcr/. Once on the TBC Library website, click on the Library Card Registration icon located in the bottom right corner and fill out the requested information, or you may call Ron Brown at 919-782-3957.

In order to use eBooks, you will have to add the <u>Libby by OverDrive</u> app to your smartphone, tablet, laptop, or desktop. You can also read them on your Kindle.

What Will Worship Be Like When We Return?...

It is certainly understandable that worship will be different than expected in many churches since the pandemic hit this year. What we once experienced and cherished less than 4 months ago seems to be something of a dream. A short time ago (and many deaths later), an invisible enemy decimated our land has changed the course of history unlike anything most of us have ever seen before. Though this virus silently stole what we knew and loved in our togetherness as people of God, it cannot take away the heart of all believers who worship the Lord in spirit and in truth. Thanks be to God for the power of that love in all of us!

Our worship as believers here at TBC is authentic, grassroots, and historical in that it is a reflection of who we are and the gifts God has given us. Those attributes will never go away, but our worship practice may feel different when we re-enter on June 28. Masks, hand sanitizers, glances and nods will replace happy faces, hand-shakes, and hugs we are used to giving away so freely. Using hymnals and pew Bibles will be replaced by technology. Singing live will be postponed for a while until it is safe to do it again without silently spreading the virus. It will seem "different" to us all, but there are some things to remember about our worship that will never change.

Not singing in worship doesn't mean no music in worship. We will provide musical opportunities through video and live instrumental music to help us "ponder anew what the Almighty can do," as the hymn, "Praise to the Lord, the Almighty" tells us. We can use the power of our minds and hearts to worship the Lord as an expression of worship. We may even grieve a bit that worship doesn't seem as "comforting" as it used to be. It's okay to feel that way, but it will require us to measure the comfort we seek and compare it to the "cost" of something we bring as an offering to God. Worship should cost us something. We will have to sacrifice some things as we knew them to be, but we will rejoice one day when we return to what we always knew as joyful and celebrative worship of Jesus. Praise from the heart doesn't change though the methods and practice may from time to time.

I would like to share an article with you I recently read. It is powerful. Spend some time studying what it says and ask God to prepare your heart through it.

Group Activity Outdoor Space

Many, many, thanks to the Allen/York Adult 4 SS Class for setting up the large tents around our property. The tents will provide some shade. The tents will not have walls so that there is adequate air-flow. These spaces are available for any group to reserve when you desire to have a function on the church grounds.

Outside spaces available onsite:

- Building A: Grassy area under trees in front of building A (FH building near Six Forks.) No tent
- Underground area Tent: Placed just outside the Underground/building D near back parking lot.
- ROC/Playground area Tent: Coming out from the back doors of ROC lobby toward Cranbrook.
- 4. ROC Parking lot Tent: Largest Tent behind ROC near Manchester.
- 5. Carter Property: No Tent
- 6. Parking lots: not tented

Guidelines for church use:

- 1. Participants must call and reserve the space with Noel Evans in church office. Reservations are available one week before each use. A new reservation is required for each use.
- Bathrooms are available in Building A and ROC lobby only. One must secure an access card
 for entry into building for bathrooms. This should be done during the reservation process.
 Bathrooms are professionally cleaned during weekdays. Bathroom access is limited on the
 weekends to ROC Lobby only to preserve sanitation for Sunday worship.
- Participants must adhere to the guidelines promoted by the church --which are displayed on the church doors.
- 4. Participants must bring their own chairs.
- 5. Spaces are available Sundays after 12:15pm and all day Monday-Saturday.
- **6.** Bandwidth on church WIFI is limited. We suggest groups use personal phone/hotspots.

A form is available online and is interactive or can be obtained by calling the church office. Our goal is to provide opportunity for your Sunday School group to meet in person, fellowship together and possibly share in a lesson or devotion. We hope these are helpful areas and can guide you in planning events.

- 1. Go outside and breathe the fresh air. Thank God for the dawning of each new day.



"It is with great regret I must inform you that the leadership evaluating the safety of activities of Trinity Baptist Church during the COVID-19 pandemic have decided our church camps should be cancelled for the summer. When planning these summer camps, we hoped COVID would not reach the pandemic level it has reached. Unfortunately, the pandemic is impacting all activities at Trinity.
