Belong. Become. Be.

This article first appeared as a Facebook post. This has been welling up inside of me for several weeks, and as a preacher, I was compelled to tell it. Please receive it with grace, love, and a challenge.

My friends, I don't have to wonder if there is racism in our nation. I don't have to ask others, "What do you mean? Define it for me?" I don't have to have someone tell me that I received messages about people of color that were implied or overt when I grew up. In my moments of honesty and clarity, I know it is all true.

I heard the jokes told by my elders and repeated them. I rarely ventured to certain parts of my city and if I did, I was nervous the whole time I was there. I would get a mixed message from those whom I loved, and I know loved me. As an adult, I know that some of them were struggling with their own knowledge and worldview. My pastors, whom I loved and respected, would say, "God loves everyone the same and Jesus died for everyone in the world." "Whosoever surely meaneth me," we would repeat. I would sing at the top of my lungs at Vacation Bible School, "Red, Yellow, Black, and White, they are precious in His sight. Jesus loves the little children of the world." Yet at the same time, I would listen to those who taught me and sang those words with conviction along side of me, use a racial slur or make a general derogatory remark about people of color and chuckle. This is my experience of growing up in the white working/middle class of the south in the mid- to late-20th century.

As a pastor, I have been threatened by a congregant when a black teenager wanted to join the church; but thanks be to God, those who wanted to follow the way of Jesus, opened the door wide in that case. I have had others in the church make comments about race that have surprised me and disappointed me. I don't assume this was your experience, but I would venture to say that many of you can relate.

Let me say, I am not angry or bitter, and I sure don't blame others for my own thoughts and actions. I still love deeply all who are a part of my past. I consider myself blessed by God because I knew I was loved deeply by my parents. I was a part of a large family that provided incredible stability even when my father died when I was a teen. I went to church every time the doors were open. The church was our life. I was taught the story of Jesus. I was taught the value of work and responsibility. I was taught to respect those in authority and to be grateful for the freedom provided by our nation. I was told to respect and love others even though sometimes it was not modeled. As an adult, I understand the struggle we have in acting like we tell our kids to act. We know better, we teach better, but sometimes we don't do better.

I became a follower of Jesus at age 9, but I will tell you that the work that the Holy

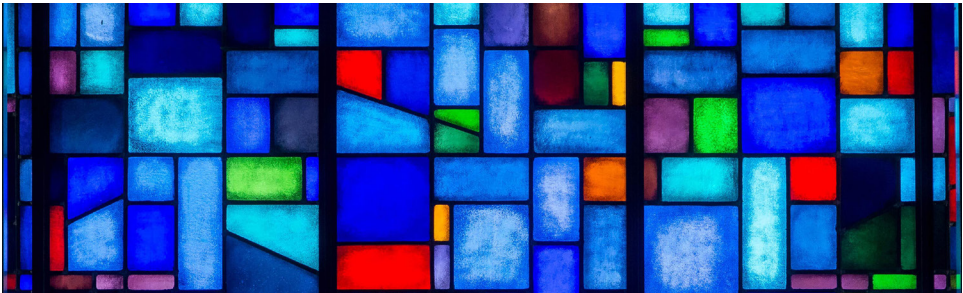

Spirit began is still occurring in me. Praise be to God! I have put old ways of thinking to the side. I have thrown them off and I continually toss them away. I don't want to pick them up ever again. I want to fully realize the transformation that comes with the mind of Christ. I want for the Holy Spirit to reveal the places where such poison in my soul still resides. I am like the father who said, "Lord, I believe, help me with my unbelief." I would utter, "Lord, I love, help me to love." You may have never had my experience. I just know what I know, and now I am telling you and now you know.

What began with justification, being right with God, continues in sanctification, becoming like Christ. I know it is a lifelong journey, but I rejoice that the older I get the more I desire it.

So, my friends, will you join me? Paul encourages us in Philipians 3:13-14: (I love how it is translated in *The Message*):

I'm not saying that I have this all together, that I have it made. But I am well on my way, reaching out for Christ, who has so wondrously reached out for me. Friends, don't get me wrong: By no means do I count myself an expert in all of this, but I've got my eye on the goal, where God is beckoning us onward—to Jesus. I'm off and running, and I'm not turning back.

NRM Food Pantry

The Food Pantry will continue to offer curbside grocery assistance for neighbors in need of food. In addition, we now offer a free Produce Stand on Thursday's at 2:30 p.m. until supplies last.

Guidance and Prayer - new!

Neighbors in need can now access guidance and prayer by telephone.

The Journey Program - new!

By combining our existing programs in an innovative solution-focused approach, this immersive, 12-week program offers clients the opportunity to achieve life-changing results. Sabbath Practice

In Genesis we learned that God created the world in seven days, but on the seventh day, God rested. So, too, are we called to rest one day per week. Sabbath is a rhythm. We set aside an hour in the day, or a day in the week, or even a week in the year. Even as we're spending more time at home, still, it's important to evaluate whether our time at home is restful or a break from the day to day. Here are some ways to practice Sabbath with your family.

- Set aside certain periods of the day where all electronics are turned off, and family members spend time together in conversation, relaxation, and prayer.
- Take one day out of the week that is dedicated to church and family.
- Talk about what feels restful to your family and make a plan to try different restful things.
- Make it a habit to have an extra special family meal one day per week. The meal doesn't have to be fancy in order to be extra special: just spend time together! Perhaps use special plates or candles.
- Spend some time in nature on your Sabbath day. Go on a nature walk, or simply spend time in your own backyard.

Memory Verse: "Remember the sabbath day, and keep it holy." Exodus 20:8

Faith Practice Spotlight: Silence. A minute of silence. How long is a minute? What does it mean to have a "Sabbath Minute?" Find a comfortable place to practice being quiet or silent for a full minute. How does it feel?
