Dear Trinity Family,

At the time of writing this article, North Carolina remains in a Phase 2 re-opening plan until August 7. This, of course, is not news we wanted to hear for various reasons. First, and most importantly, because it means that our state is still dealing with high cases of COVID-19. It also means that our waiting period regarding worship continues. As I stated on June 28th, we would not set a date for worship on campus at this time but will continue to monitor the situation. Our advisory team continues to meet each week and discern our best way forward in regards to worship and other activities. I know that each delay is disappointing to many. It is true that some congregations have been worshipping. It is also true that the majority of congregations have not resumed worship services, and some that have begun have had to cancel due to the rising risk in their location. Each church must make these hard decisions regarding their situation and congregation.

While we wait on beginning in-person worship on campus, it is important to know that as a congregation we are finding ways to meet and encourage each other. It is true that most people in our congregation are staying in touch, studying the Bible, and worshipping in online platforms. However, many have taken advantage of the opportunities that have been created for people to come together.

Numerous Sunday school classes continue to use our outside tent areas for gatherings. Our College class is meeting weekly in back yards of members. Our youth are using our campus for gathering and fellowship. Our Senior Adults have had a parking lot fellowship in their cars, and we are working with them on finding creative ways for them to see one another. I also know that many Sunday school classes are being very creative and having gatherings at other outside venues. In each of these cases, members of our congregation continue to act responsibly toward one another by following the best practices that we all are aware of during this pandemic.

On July 29th our Student Ministry has planned an outside worship experience to honor our graduates before they leave for college. This is open to the congregation and details can be found in the newsletter. In addition, our Children's Ministry is planning small gatherings of family groups with the use of our outside locations.

I want to remind you that the church campus is available for your use to gather. We have several large tents that provide a gathering space for groups up to 25. Also, as we stated several weeks ago, we can accommodate groups up to 10 in inside spaces. This is keeping with the best practices as suggested by our health experts. In each of these cases, we encourage you to contact the church office and we will make the proper arrangements for you; also, we will inform you concerning entry, restrooms, and other matters. I am grateful to all who are being creative in helping our congregation continue to meet, whether it is online or in person.

Our ministry to our community continues during this time as well. We continue to collect items for North Raleigh Ministries, Raleigh Rescue Mission, and we also are participating again with Family Promise.

We also are going to be offering a Weekday Pre-School Summer Session in August as a ministry to so many working parents. Our Weekday Director, Bentley Williams, has done a tremendous job in helping us to prepare for this ministry in August. We have been working with consultants in our church and our consultant from the State to help us prepare for this ministry re-opening. Our plan exceeds CDC guidelines for safety and has received support from our Trustees and our Advisory Team. It is so important to find ways to minister to families who are faced with many challenges in this time.

While we wait, there is much going on behind the scenes here at the church. Our worship team will be working in the next few weeks to re-engage and to finish the training of our usher and greeter volunteers and review our worship plans. This will ensure that we are ready, without delay, to begin worship in person at the proper time. Our Sunday School Council is devising a plan for inside-space use for Sunday school classes. This plan would enable the use of inside classrooms for classes who are ready to make that shift yet also enable classes to continue online offerings as well. Our Church Council is also meeting this month and will be discussing programming and ministries for the fall calendar.

As I have thought about our situation as a church in this pandemic, I am reminded that what we need in order to endure this season are the very things that we develop when following Jesus. Paul reminds us that the fruit of the Holy Spirit - or we might say the evidence that God's Spirit is working our lives - are the qualities of:

Love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control.

In this crisis we must love each other. In this season, we must discover and look for the joy that exists. We must bear with one another and be kind. We must be disciplined and stay the course. We must be gentle and self-controlled, which simply means we must keep ourselves under control in how we act toward one another and react to situations.

I encourage you to continue to open your heart to the work of the Holy Spirit. If there is ever a time when God's people need to display the very gifts of God, it is now. I have confidence, Church, that you are the people of God and you will live faithfully into that identity.

A WORD FROM THE CHURCH TREASURER

TBC Financial Update

July, 2020

Thank you for your ongoing commitment to providing TBC with the financial resources needed to continue the mission of our church during this unprecedented time.

Through May our giving was 97.1% of budget which put us about \$40,000 short of budgeted revenues. While June numbers are not yet finalized so far it appears we lost more ground for revenues for the month. To be on pace to meet budget through June we needed receipts of \$1,652,842. Actual receipts were \$1,566,115 making revenues thru June short of budget by \$86,727 or 5.2%. If you are traveling this summer please remember that TBC has multiple automatic giving methods available.

Thank you to ministers, staff, and TBC committees for continuing to do an excellent job monitoring expenses. As a result of these efforts we continue to see actual expenses well under budgeted expenses. Actual year to date expenses through June should come in at \$1,334,890. This is almost \$318,000 (or 21%) less than budget! As a result of revenues being 94.8% of budget and expenses being 79% of budget we will end June with revenues over expenses by approximately \$171,456.

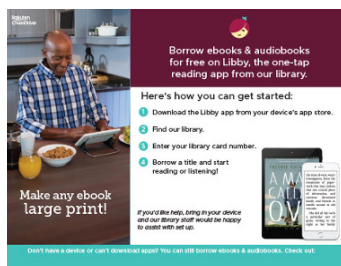

Weekday Preschool will be offering a Summer session for 3 weeks beginning August 10.

We are excited and anxious about this re-opening of our facilities and providing a service for essential workers. We will be serving about ¼ of our normal number of students. This will be a test to see how we plan to safely open in September. Bentley Williams, our wonderful Weekday Director has attended webinars, interviewed experts that have already assisted schools and studied the CDC and AAP requirements. It is a mammoth task. We have lots of requirements from our state and the CDC. The school will be taking every precaution. We have even stepped up some of the suggestions to adjust to our facility and our own concerns.

With all this, the preschool area will be inaccessible for those outside of staff during the Weekday hours. Our teachers will be confined to the classroom with their own children for the day. Only access will be to go outside. We will not be moving around the building either. We are taking the most restrictive measures to insure good contact tracing and social distancing. This also means that the Preschool hallway and classrooms will be locked 24/7. You will have to contact Bentley Williams or myself if you choose to enter after hours. Once our school is sanitized for the next day, we need to keep it that way. The area can be breached if necessary, but we must have an account of you. That way we can contact trace and call you should we have a positive test result.

As always, thank you for your support and assistance with this vital ministry to our community.

Grief Share

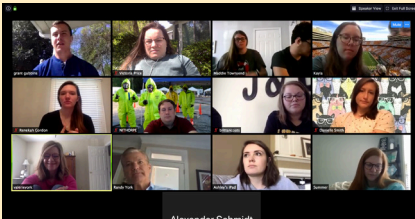
