Dear Trinity Family,

As you are aware, we began returning to campus for worship in the sanctuary beginning on August 16. We are currently holding one worship service at 10:55 a.m. This service is offered in person and online for those who would like to continue to worship virtually at this time. I am so grateful to all those who have helped us arrive at this point of transition during the COVID-19 pandemic. In particular, I want to thank Mark Owens for all of his hard work behind the scenes. Mark has been producing our virtual worship that has been streamed online while we were away from the campus. He has done a tremendous job in editing and creating a time of worship that has been meaningful to so many of us. Mark will continue to aid us as we move into this "hybrid" moment of worship services.

This past week we also began a summer Weekday Preschool session. This was also an important step for our congregation. Offering this ministry to working parents in our community is of great help to families. All has gone well because of the work of our Weekday Director Bentley Williams, Rev. Eickhoff, and our whole weekday preschool staff. Continue to keep this ministry in your prayers.

We asked our deacons in July to help us prioritize our energy in reviewing and planning for programs and ministry in our transition back to campus. The three top priorities were in this order: worship, Sunday School, and Wednesday Night Programs. We are working toward reestablishing in-person meetings based on these priorities.

Our Sunday School Council is working on plans, which will allow Sunday School classes to reserve rooms to meet in person. They have identified four rooms that are the best for meeting at this time. These rooms are the Fellowship Hall, C101, A214, and the Chapel. These rooms were chosen because of easy entrance from outside and access to restrooms. These rooms are being set up for social distancing, technology and capacity. Currently, we are restricting the number to 10 to 15 people, but we anticipate that in a few weeks we will be ready to use each of the four rooms at their social distancing capacity. Our next step, as a Sunday School Council, will be to begin to have classes reserve these rooms to meet in person. We are currently asking that Sunday morning not be one of the meeting times as we are seeking first to facilitate worship only on Sunday mornings. Sunday afternoons and evenings are available.

Our Church Council also has a working team concerning our Wednesday Night Programs. They have begun meeting to discuss how we might utilize Wednesday nights for missions, music, and discipleship. We hope to have a plan to share in the near future.

Of course, there are other things happening at the church from mission efforts, to funerals, weddings, and many virtual and outside gatherings. Everyone is being creative

and faithful in this difficult time. I am deeply appreciative for our church's patience, faithfulness, and concern for each other.

As we began 2020 we adopted this revised mission statement:

TBC is a family of baptized believers joining hands with God - belonging, becoming and being - by proclaiming and living the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

We welcome you to...

Belong in meaningful connection with the community of faith.

Become purposefully engaged with the family of faith: following the way of Jesus through baptism, sharing life together and serving others.

Be a lifelong disciple of lesus, growing in relationship with God, joining God's mission of love for the world.

There is nothing in our mission statement that COVID-19 can keep us from accomplishing. I want you to consider how you are finding meaningful connections with our congregation. In what ways are you following the way of Jesus? How are you growing in your faith during this time?

Trinity is still a congregation where you can belong, become, and be.

Join us on Tuesday Nights beginning September 15 for our Fall Semester TNT Bible Study for Men and Women. We will be studying "Dealing with Hard Times."




TNT 7all 2020

When we worship together on Sunday mornings, hymn singing is one of my favorite things we do as a church. The beautiful texts and tunes have made an impact on my life since I sang in my home church as a kid. My parents gave me my first hymnal when I was around nine years old, so the old hymns from that Baptist Hymnal (1956 edition) still bring a wellspring of joy to my heart when I sing them. I miss those days of our congregational singing.

I challenged the Sanctuary Choir this past week in a Zoom fellowship to recall their favorite hymns and anthems we sing and to practice vocalizing every day. One day we will meet again in the Sanctuary praising our Savior and I want to be in the best voice I can be in to sing His praises. I miss the energy, the spirit, and the deep sense of unity we experience when we sing in worship. When we do meet again and can sing safely, I want to belt-out my praise and thanksgiving to a God who heals and saves.

There is a website, hymnary.org, where you can go and look up any hymn so that you can read the text and play it. I encourage you to go and select some of your favorite hymns and sing them to make your voice ready for praise. How good and pleasant it will be to sing in unity of spirit and voice!

Every year at this time families are filling out forms for their children to enter their new school year. For many families this means that after a summer of food insecurity their children will be guaranteed to be fed at least breakfast and lunch on school days. It is a sigh of relief and a burden lifted for five of the seven days each week. But, what about the other two days? Do the children just go hungry? Yes. And, this is where Backpack Buddies and You step up to the literal plate. Backpack Buddies is a national program that only works when local organizations take on the challenge to serve their own populations through the schools. The schools know which children need to receive food over the weekends, and the local organizations help make that happen.

Our church supports Backpack Buddies at five local elementary schools and one local middle school through North Raleigh Ministries. This support is in addition to the food pantry at NRM and has different specific needs for food. One major way we support the Backpack Buddies program is through our North Hills 5K.
