During these uncertain times, we have all been attracted to things that are certain. This is especially true for me in my own walk with Jesus. A few months ago, I looked at the books in my office and was drawn to books I had read years ago that had a profound impact on me. One of those books was Richard Foster's book, *Celebration of Discipline*. This book has become a classic for introducing people to the Spiritual Disciplines of the Christian Life. As I read chapters on meditation, prayer, fasting, and study to simplicity, solitude, submission and service, I was reminded of how these disciplines can help lead us to a deeper life with Christ.

If you are like me and grew up in a Baptist church, you did not learn about Christian disciplines. We were taught to have a daily "quiet time." That time was for reading the Bible, reflecting on the passage, listening to what God might say and then a time of prayer. Sometimes we were also encouraged to write or journal our thoughts during our quiet time. When I went to Seminary, I discovered that much of what I had been taught as a child, teen and college student about my "quiet time", was actually encompassed in the Spiritual Disciplines of the Christian life.

After re-reading this classic book, I was moved to plan a sermon series on several of the Christian disciplines. As I have thought about this sermon series, I knew I wanted us all to know about certain disciplines and practices that might help us deepen our walk with Christ. However, the deeper I have studied these practices I have come to the conviction that the main reason we need to know about these practices and follow them is that they are the "way of Jesus." That is, Jesus practiced these same disciplines in his life. It is his example that we follow when we practice these disciplines. Jesus is our example of meditating on God's word. Jesus is our example of prayer, fasting and studying the scripture. Jesus shows us how to live lives of simplicity, solitude, submission and service. Jesus calls us to a life filled with confession, worship and celebration.

During the Season of Lent we will make a journey together and visit or re-visit these very disciplines that will call us to a deeper walk with Jesus. I will be preaching on various disciplines, and we are writing a devotional book to accompany my sermon series. Various groups will be meeting (virtually) to encourage each other as we journey together. In addition, we are developing a podcast and other social media information to help us as we study. Information on all of this can be found in our newsletter. I want to invite you to join us beginning Feb. 17 for our Ash Wednesday experience and for the Sundays that will lead us to the cross and resurrection.

Richard Foster begins *Celebration of Discipline* with these words:
Superficiality is the curse of our age. The doctrine of instant satisfaction is a primary spiritual problem. The desperate need today is not for a greater number of intelligent people, or gifted people, but for deep people.

I am looking forward to our journey.

N.C. Baptists on Mission Hurricane Florence Response BUILDING TOGETHER, RELIEF FOR TODAY, HOPE FOR TOMORROW



God has opened many doors for Baptists on Mission in the aftermath of Hurricane Florence. Through relief, recovery, repair, or rebuild, Baptists on Mission has been present and active sharing God's love through word and deed. By our commitment and support, help will continue to be there making a lasting impact on God's people. For the past two years, Trinity Baptist Disaster Relief Team has

been active in this effort to get people back in their homes. Through both individual and team response, there have been monthly responses for 2018, 2019 and responses in January, February, November and December 2020.

On December 14-17, 2020, a Trinity team of 6 persons responded to Rose Hill, NC—one feeding person and five construction persons. The construction team put down flooring, base boards, trimmed two exterior doors, painted trim around doors and windows, painted doors, and helped install porch railings.

The house is for Mr. Martin Herring. For two years, Martin Herring has lived in an RV with no running water, and a generator provided his electricity. Soon Mr. Herring will settle into a safe and secure home on his grandfather's land that dates back to the early 1900's.

For months after Hurricane Florence, Mr. Herring was so distraught he didn't know where to turn or who to believe. Mr. Herring said, "I had so many people promise they'd be here, but they never came through." Then, N.C. Baptists on Mission showed up.

Mr. Herring said "I wanted to believe Richard from Disaster Relief, but I was so shellshocked, I didn't know what to think."

When Mr. Herring watched disaster relief volunteers working out of the Charity Center pour the foundation for his new home, he danced with joy.

Mr. Herring said, "Sometimes it's like a dream, but one day soon, I'm going to wake up and see it's not a dream. I have no idea what that first day will be like, but it's going to be my house. Thank you. Thank you!"

As you read this, Mr. Herring will be in his home thanks to all God's dedicated people working together in word and deed.

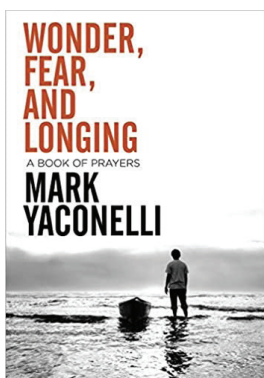

YOUNG ADULT PRAYER GATHERING

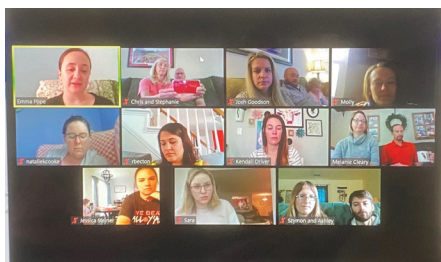
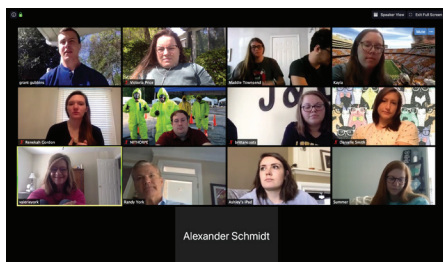

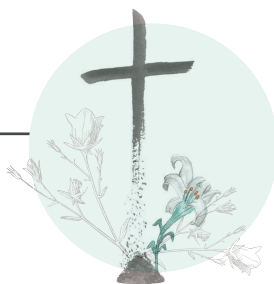
