One of my favorite stories to tell, which actually happened to me, occurred in my first pastorate. I was on my way to a funeral of a church member's family when I got lost trying to find a rural church. This was before GPS and so at that point I had two choices. I could continue to drive around hoping to find the church building, or I could do what most men hate to do and find someone to ask for directions. I came across a country store, parked my car and went inside. I greeted the man behind the counter and asked if he could give me directions to Old Pond Baptist Church. He looked me over and then asked a question I will never forget. He asked me, "Where are you coming from?" I thought to myself, "Where am I coming from?" I looked him in the eye and responded, "Sir, I am coming from right here."

It really did not matter how I had arrived at the country store. What mattered the most, in that moment, was how do I get from the country store to the church. Knowing where you are now and where you are going can be more important than where you have been. As a congregation, we always want to be "on our way" with Jesus. We continue to ask, "God, where are you leading?"

As we have navigated the challenges of this past year, it has been important to determine where we are as a congregation and keep our focus on where God is leading in the future. In many ways, where God is leading us is always a place of where we have never been before. God is always leading us into God's future prepared for us. To go into that future always requires faith and obedience regardless of a pandemic. Yet, we must admit that the unknown of what lies ahead, after the pandemic is over, can cause us anxiety, even as we look forward to many of the precautions we have undertaken going away. In this moment, I think it is important to remind us as a congregation where we are in April of 2021. What is our current starting place? I would like to share some good news and the challenges we still face.

First, the good news is that our congregation remains strong in mission, faithfulness and engagement. Currently we are having around 300 in on campus attendance on Sunday morning for worship. The majority of our congregation still remain connected through our virtual worship service. At this point, 12 of our 22 Adult Classes have returned to campus for Sunday School and are functioning in a hybrid model of in person teaching and virtual class. We also know that those who are gathering on campus and those who are yet to gather, continue to have high engagement of class members. In fact, many Sunday School classes report they have more online engagement than they had in person attendance before the pandemic. This is one of the reasons some classes are hesitant to return to campus until the large majority of the class is ready to do so.

In addition to our Sunday School engagement, we continue to have Discipleship classes and Bible Studies that are both in person and online. Many have found these to be helpful in their continued spiritual growth. Our Children's Ministry and Student Ministry are offering various on campus and online experiences to our children, students and families. Our Senior Adults are becoming more active in attendance and in fellowship. This has been so important as many of them were isolated for a very long time.

Our Missions Ministry has continued to provide ministry to our community and beyond. Through mission collections, disaster relief trips, funds to our mission partners and other hands-on activities, we have been faithful to minister beyond our congregation. Our music ministry, although very hampered by the restrictions of the pandemic, has discovered new ways to provide inspiring music for worship. I am so grateful for our musicians who have stepped forward during this time. The ROC is also open for walking and working out, and we are beginning group classes with protocols in place. We also celebrate the faithfulness of so many who have served our congregation behind the scenes during this year. Our Deacons, Trustees, teachers and all of our committees have been so faithful to their tasks. In addition to this, our congregation's faithfulness in giving has been tremendous. Financially the church is in great shape and able to continue the ministry we have now and before us. Thank you for being so faithful.

There is much to celebrate as we arrive in April of 2021 but we admit there are challenges we still have before us. The three most challenging aspects of the next few months remain in three areas of our congregation. The first is in regards to our children and students. As we continue to navigate health risks for children, students and for their adult leaders, there are still more questions than answers at this point. We continue to follow the best practices we can to reduce risk and to keep families safe. This means that as we move ahead we will be seeking to discover ways to increase our ministry to and with families with children. We are going to be expanding our capacity for family Sunday School in the ROC. In addition, we are working hard to create an Extended Teaching Care model for the summer that would allow families with young children to attend worship and their child be cared for during worship. Our Nominating Committee is also hard at work securing teachers and leaders for our Children's Ministry when we begin the new church year in the fall. Our student ministry will continue to meet and will utilize outdoor spaces and activities for teaching and fellowship.

A second challenge we face is in regards to our music ministry. As we know at Trinity, we love our choirs, ensembles and congregational singing. One of the hardest parts of the pandemic has been the higher risk of singing together. This means that we have been restricted on how to sing together and we all miss the incredible ministry our Sanctuary Choir and others offered us week to week. In recent weeks, Rev. Byers has led an effort to begin to reengage our singers and musicians. We have a team consisting of Music Committee members and choir members who are helping to give leadership to planning how we can reintroduce the depth of our music ministry back into the life of our church. We all are looking forward to that day. I ask you to pray for wisdom and guidance in this matter.

Our final challenge for the days ahead will be volunteers for the ministries God has for us in the future. As we return to gathering and to being able to offer our many ministries again, it will be important for all of us to ask, "Where is my spot?" What is God calling you to do in the life of our congregation? What gift do you have to offer the body of Christ? As we move into the future God has for us, it will be important we all find our spot and "join hands with God."

Let me finish this long article (I think the longest article I have written in 21 years as your pastor) by saying thank you for all you have done during this difficult challenge. I am confident in our congregation and more so I am confident in Christ and the work of the Holy Spirit in us and through us.

As I told the man behind the counter in the country store, "This is where I am beginning." Only God knows what great things are in store for us.


