During the year 2020, our church responded with such generosity that we gave more than our budget needs. We ended 2020 with a budget surplus. Our Finance Committee and Trustees recommended to the church in our March Church Conference how to use the 2020 surplus. Some of the funds have been paid on our debt while others have been set aside for some large capital needs which include a new chiller for the E building later this year. The Personnel Committee was given funds to give one-time bonuses to our staff for their hard work during this past year. As you may remember, our 2021 budget did not include any raises for staff since we were budgeting in very uncertain times. Our staff is so grateful for such generosity and care shown to us. In addition, I am so glad we are able to continue to pay down our debt and also make sure we have the funds to care for our campus. However, the most exciting part of our surplus was the additional gifts we could make to our mission partners.

Our Missions Steering Committee formed a sub-group that received input from all on our Missions Steering Committee and assessed needs with various mission partners. Our Missions Chairperson, Fred McDuffee, shared with me the committee's decision regarding these extra funds. I am so excited to share how Trinity is making a difference around the world due to your continued faithfulness and generosity. Our surplus mission giving will be distributed in this manner:

Cooperative Giving

An extra \$9,151.00 dollars will be sent to our cooperative work with CBF and the SBC. Another \$915.00 will be given to the Raleigh Baptist Association.

International Missions

\$30,000 dollars will be given for the following ministries:

- \$10,000 for church planting in Belgium through the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship. This is an Arabic-speaking church plant.
- \$10,000 for Refugee and Migrant humanitarian aid for the Karen People Group in Northern Africa. (CBF Missionaries are working with this people group.)
- \$10,000 for Door of Hope in South Africa. This will help to fund a "baby house" as part of this orphan rescue ministry. This is in partnership with North Carolina Baptist On Mission.

State and Local Missions

North Carolina Children's Homes

- \$5,000 for Playground Fence and \$2,200 for Bike Path - Mills Home

Disaster Relief of North Carolina Baptist On Mission

- \$10,105 for William Davis House

Prison Ministry- \$6,728 for Re-Direction Housing

North Raleigh Ministries- \$10,900 for 2 Commercial Refrigerators for Food Ministry

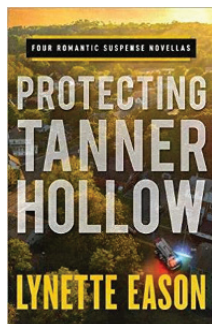

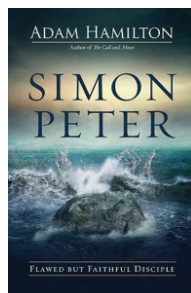

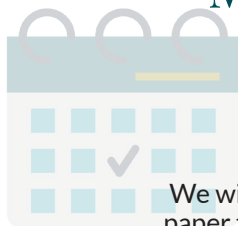
