As I write this article, we are preparing for July 4th and the celebration of our freedom as Americans. In the past few weeks, I have been reflecting on how to celebrate July 4th and what this day means to me. First, as an American, I am proud of our nation, the freedom that is ours; and I give thanks for those whose brilliant minds conceived the very idea of our nation, forged it through personal sacrifice and for all who have defended her, served her and led us through good and challenging times. When it comes to celebrating July 4th, I join with others and place my hand over my heart, recite the pledge and sing loudly our national anthem with pride. It is a privilege to live as a citizen of the United States of America.

However, I have always been conflicted in how the church should celebrate July 4th and other national holidays. How do we make sure that when we meet together to worship God we worship God and nothing or no one else? How do we, in turn, not miss the opportunity to give respect and honor to whom respect and honor is due as we are instructed to do?

Recently I reached out to the highest-ranking officers I personally know. These two men have served our nation as military leaders on active duty and in the reserves. One retired as a general and the other as a colonel. We met to discuss the very questions that I raise. As three brothers in Christ who love the Lord, are proud Americans, and grateful citizens, we discussed the nature of the church and what it means to live out our values and mission statements.

In our value statement at Trinity we find: (We believe in) The separation of church and state and the concepts of a free church and a free state.

Included in our "What We Believe" statement we confess under Religious Liberty: **Church and state** should be separate. The Christian ideal is a free Church in a free state, and this ideal implies the right of free and unhindered access to God on the part of all people.

In our discussion we shared our thoughts, views and hopes not only for our church but also for our nation. What I received from them was the encouragement and admonition to do three things.

- Always make worship about God and always preach the good news of Jesus above all things.
- 2. Honor those who deserve honor like those who served in our military and those who serve our nation in other ways.
 - 3. Teach the congregation the importance of the separation of church and state and do all we can to keep these two important loyalties in proper order and perspective.

As your Pastor, I will seek to be mindful of this encouragement. I am grateful for these leaders and for all who love the Lord, his church, and as proud Americans honor our nation and the freedom we enjoy.



SIMON PETER: FLAWED BUT FAITHFUL DISCIPLE




