I do not often write about financial matters in our newsletter. However, this week I want to share not only good news about your faithfulness in giving to our church but how such faithfulness is creating opportunities for us to make a difference in lives here in Raleigh and around the world. Each month we meet for our Church Conference and do the “business” of the church. I would admit to you that the prospects of spending 30 minutes to an hour listening to committee reports might not seem exciting to most people. However, in this case what is being reported is about God’s people joining God’s mission in this world. This past Church Conference there were three reports that I want to share with you.

First, Rev. Brooks Warren shared an update on Ridge Road Baptist Church. Nearly a year ago we were approached by Ridge Road Baptist Church to be a part of a revisioning and restart for this congregation. Ridge Road has had a long history of ministry in their part of Raleigh. However, over the past few years the church has experienced decline to the point a decision had to be made about its future. We were so excited to be invited to be a part of putting together a new vision and direction for this congregation. We joined with several other sister Baptist churches here in Raleigh to help Ridge Road redream its future and begin to live into that vision. Through gifts from the Raleigh Baptist Association, The Cooperative Baptist Fellowship of North Carolina and from several sister Baptist congregations, Ridge Road has now secured a transitional pastor and is starting the process of a new start. As part of this process, Trinity has pledged to give \$15,000 for the next two years to create a budget for outreach events for the congregation. Rev. Warren, who is our representative for this mission endeavor, reported that the church is growing in attendance and is planning their first outreach event. We rejoice with this news and count it a joy to be a part of what God is doing new in this sister congregation.

The second item was a report on North Raleigh Ministries. Through North Raleigh Ministry’s “Backpack Buddies Plus Program,” families receive 14 meals per child under the age of 18 per week. This covered 1,585 children who experience insecurity in our own community. Trinity’s financial gifts to North Raleigh Ministry last year totaled \$94,041. Your gifts to Trinity are passed on to partners like North Raleigh Ministry and are making a real difference in the lives of our neighbors.

The third item reported was a motion from our Trustees and Finance Committee on how to utilize our budget surplus from 2021. It is amazing to me that in some of the most trying times for the church in recent years, your faithfulness in giving created a large surplus for the year. Because of your faithfulness a motion was presented that included items like paying down the debt, facility upgrades, and personnel needs. However, what excited me the most was the first line of the motion is to give an additional 20% of the surplus to our mission partners. We will be giving an additional \$53,849 to missionaries on the field. This amount will be divided between the CBF Global Missions Offering and the International Mission Board of the SBC. In addition, another \$53,849 will be distributed to our local mission partners through our Missions Steering Committee. This means that our mission partners will receive an additional \$107,699 in gifts from Trinity. This is a significant gift beyond our current mission budget of \$309,711.

Jesus said, where your treasure is there your heart will be also. As I left the Church Conference, I was grateful to be part of a church that is generous in giving and on mission. You might not think of Church Conference as a time of celebration but for sure this is good news and is worth celebrating.

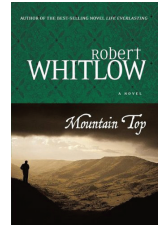
