During the season of Lent, we have been making our way to Jerusalem with Jesus. During Holy Week we will be focusing on the last week of Jesus' life before crucifixion and resurrection. On Palm Sunday we will have a worship service filled with scripture, hymns, anthems, and reflective music. The focus of the day will be on the final week of Jesus as he arrives in Jerusalem. Our 8:45 a.m. worship service will be filled with scripture, reflection, hymns, and soloists as we make our journey with Jesus. Our 10:55 a.m. service will be similar with our Sanctuary Choir offering majority of the music with six different powerful anthems. Whichever service you choose for that day, you will make the journey with Jesus to Jerusalem. I encourage you to invite someone to join you for this special day of worship.

Our Maunday Thursday Service will be at 6:30 p.m. It will be a night of reflection and communion. We will have a supper at 5:30 p.m. that evening and ask that you pre-register for the supper by calling the church office or through the church website.

Finally, on Easter Sunday we will join for Easter celebration beginning with our 7:00 a.m. Community Sunrise Service at St. Timothy's Episcopal Church on Six Forks Rd. This will be the first time in several decades the North Hills churches will join for a Sunrise Service. This was a North Hills tradition for many years that we are looking forward to beginning again. You can join us for sunrise service and then at Trinity for our 8:45 a.m. or 10:55 a.m. service with Sunday School at 9:45 a.m.
