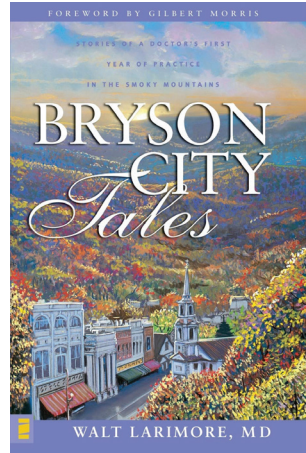

Ukraine Relief Effort Through our Baptist Partners

The United Nations reports that more than 3.5 million refugees, mostly women and children, have fled Ukraine seeking shelter in neighboring countries. In addition, millions more are displaced within Ukraine. From 1994-2000, NC Baptists enjoyed a fruitful partnership with Ukrainian Baptists. Strong relationships were established with our Ukrainian brothers and sisters. We grieve and pray for them now in their hour of need.

Over the past 20 years, Trinity has served in short term missions through medical and dental teams and ministry teams serving with the Roma people in the Carpathian region. We have offered compassionate dental and medical care while holding their babies and teaching them about God's Love.

Through our partnership with the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship, we have supported the presence of field personnel, Mina and Gennady Podgaisky, for the last 19 years in Kyiv as they have ministered through the Village of Hope, a ministry center that assists foster families and serves as the operations base to facilitate bible studies, counseling, family seminars, retreats, and skills training.

We ask you to join us in prayer for families who have been separated, those who have lost loved ones, and those who are fleeing the violence in their country. Lift up those who are selflessly providing transportation, shelter, counseling, and needed supplies to the refugees – sometimes at great personal risk.

Join us as we pray specifically for our missions partners as they continue to serve though their hearts are breaking and they face great personal risk.

This month, your Missions Steering Committee voted to send \$47,000 out of last year's budget surplus to meet these great needs. \$23,500 was sent through Baptists on Mission, and \$23,500 was sent through the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship Global Missions.

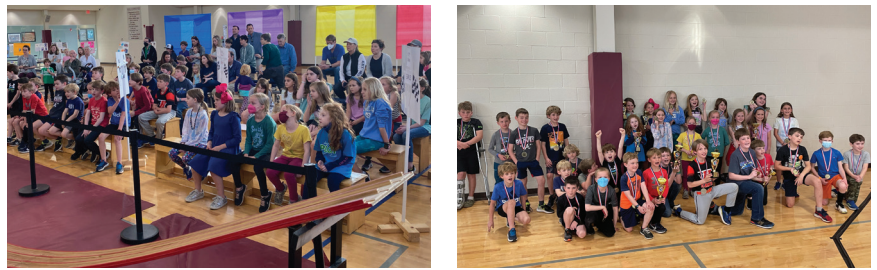
