



Sunday School News no sunday school on may 29 one worship at 10:30am

Twenty-nine years is a wonderful tenure in any occupation. But to share it in ministry with those you love is a true gift. I am grateful for a strong church in which to serve. I am grateful for the way you have allowed me to reinvent and reinvest my calling and be an advocate for women and children, a trainer of leaders and a writer of curriculum. Thank you for being church and family to me for 29 years. Thank you for the kind notes and thoughtful ways you have shown appreciation.

Being trained as a teacher is a discipline to nurture. I learned early on that the church must also teach and prepare her members to share, to care and to prepare. There is a world that needs to know about Christ and we are called to be His witness. Our example for teaching comes from Jesus. Jesus of Nazareth spent his life in a tiny country but his purpose encompassed the world. His public career lasted only 3 years. But His influence has lasted for nearly 21 centuries.

How did he do it? How was Christ able to have so much influence in such a short time? When we look to the gospels, the answer comes through with clarity. Jesus was first and foremost a Teacher. He preached the good news of the kingdom of God; but his hearers called him Teacher. He healed the sick and comforted the troubled; but those who benefited from his ministry knew him as Teacher. He called disciples to his side; they thought of him as Teacher. Jesus rebuked hypocrisy and sterile tradition, thus incurring the wrath of religious leaders. And even those who opposed him, addressed him as "Teacher." His followers would eventually come to know him as "Christ," Savior," and "Lord." But even beyond the resurrection, their vision of him as "Teacher" remained undiminished.

In the Gospel narratives, teaching is clearly the most characteristic activity of the ministry of Jesus. And so, this is a lesson for us. Jesus commands us in Matthew 28 to "go and make disciples of all nations.....and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you."

The church must teach. We must encourage one another. We must continue to study and have our lives changed and to help change other lives by what we learn from the Master.

Please show appreciation to your Sunday School teacher and those of your children or youth for the effort they give toward preparing and teaching each week. If you are not in a Sunday School Class, let me encourage you to find one and prepare to learn. If you are interested in a small group Bible study, please contact me. If you are seeking to study on your own, do not neglect the fellowship that comes from learning and supporting others.

Door of Hope in South Africa OCTOBER 13-25, 2022

Through our partnership with Baptists on Mission, our Trinity Team will have the opportunity to help build small cottages that will house an average of 6 children along with a host couple. Cottages will be made of interlocking cement blocks that will be made on site and then stacked to build the cottages. The process is quite simple and does not require skilled labor. We will have the opportunity to worship with and encourage local churches, and we will discover that the encouragement and the missions effort certainly goes both ways.

Since 1999, Door of Hope has rescued over 1750 abandoned infants with the goal of providing them a temporary Christian home while seeking long term foster care or permanent homes for each one. There are many older children not chosen for adoption who need a long term home, and that is where these cottages and foster parents come in.

North Raleigh Ministries Launches New Transitions Program to Support Families

When someone is in crisis (be it job loss, a medical emergency or other financial harships), they often feel stuck, not knowing what next steps to take or how to overcome that crisis. Through Transitions, NRM seeks to meet their spiritual, emotional and physical needs, equip them to overcome their current crisis and help them better prepare for future crises. With **22,700 families** living paycheck to paycheck in our community, Transistions is an essential part of the program model that sets people on a path to a more stable future, provides the tools to move forward and equips them to walk through unexpected challenges with strength and hope.

The Transitions Program provides 6-8 weeks of one-on-one meetings with a case manager, identifying and assessing areas in life that participants want to change, setting solution-focused goals to make those changes a reality, and weekly groceries to save funds for other critical expenses.
